BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- The civil service to which this chapter applies shall 4 comprise all positions in the State now existing or hereafter 5 established and embrace all personal services performed for the 6 State, except the following:
 - Commissioned and enlisted personnel of the Hawaii (1)national guard as such, and positions in the Hawaii national guard that are required by state or federal laws or regulations or orders of the national guard to be filled from those commissioned or enlisted personnel;
 - (2) Positions filled by persons employed by contract where the director of human resources development has certified that the service is special or unique or is essential to the public interest and that, because of circumstances surrounding its fulfillment, personnel

to perform the service cannot be obtained through



1		normal civil service recruitment procedures. Any such
2		contract may be for any period not exceeding one year;
3	(3)	Positions that must be filled without delay to comply
4		with a court order or decree if the director
5		determines that recruitment through normal recruitment
6		civil service procedures would result in delay or
7		noncompliance, such as the Felix-Cayetano consent
