BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050;
- 17 provided that section 1 shall take effect on January 1, 2013.

Gambling; Lottery; Sweepstakes

Description:

Amends definition of advance gambling activity to clarify that purchase of sweepstakes entry that also provides nominal nongambling value advances gambling even if sweepstakes entry can be obtained without payment of consideration. Eliminates free play, beginning 01/01/2013, as a defense under certain circumstances. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)
