A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO IOLANI PALACE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Law enforcement jurisdiction over the grounds
2	of the Iolani Palace currently resides with the department of
3	land and natural resources as a state park. The legislature
4	finds that the functions of law enforcement officers of the
5	department of land and natural resources are stretched thin by
6	the vast array of land and natural resources under the
7	department's jurisdiction, including public parks, forests,
8	beaches, oceans, and other public lands.
9	The legislature further finds that the department of public
10	safety, sheriffs' division, which has jurisdiction over the
11	adjacent State Capitol, is the more appropriate law enforcement
12	agency to have jurisdiction over the Iolani Palace buildings and
13	grounds.
14	It is not the intent of this Act to transfer:
15	(1) The management of the historic preservation functions
16	of the department of land and natural resources for

Iolani Palace; or

         SECTION 2. Section 171-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

    amended to read as follows:

         "§171-3 Department of land and natural resources.

    The department of land and natural resources shall be headed by
    an executive board to be known as the board of land and natural

    resources. The department shall manage, administer, and

    exercise control over public lands, the water resources, ocean

    waters, navigable streams, coastal areas (excluding commercial

    harbor areas), and minerals and all other interests therein and
    exercise such powers of disposition thereof as may be authorized
16
    by law. The department shall also manage and administer the

    state parks, historical sites, forests, forest reserves, aquatic

    life, aquatic life sanctuaries, public fishing areas, boating,

    ocean recreation, coastal programs, wildlife, wildlife
    sanctuaries, game management areas, public hunting areas,

18		take all actions deemed necessary and appropriate for
19		the proper and efficient administration of the
20		department.
21	(b)	Effective July 1, 2012 the department of public safety

1	grounds of Tolani Palace, for the purpose of preserving the
2	public peace, preventing crime, detecting and arresting
3	offenders of the law, protecting the rights of persons and
4	property, and enforcing and preventing violation of all laws and
5	any administrative rules of the department of land and natural
6	resources. The department of public safety shall consult with
7	the department of land and natural resources on the
8	interpretation and application of any administrative rule for
9	purposes of this subsection. This subsection shall not be
10	construed to:
11	(1) Authorize sheriffs of the department of public safety
12	to enter into the Iolani Palace building other than
13	for law enforcement purposes when warranted by the
14	circumstances; or
15	(2) Relieve the Honolulu police department from any law
16	enforcement duties with regards to Iolani Palace;
17 [:]	provided that the department of public safety shall
18	have primary law enforcement jurisdiction for Iolani
19	Palace.
20	[[(b)]] <u>(c)</u> The department of public safety shall report
21	to the legislature not later than twenty days prior to the
22	commencement of the 2008 regular session, and every session

- 2 ongoing problems in providing the appropriate mental health care
- 3 to committed persons under its jurisdiction."
- 4 SECTION 4. The department of public safety shall commence
- 5 law enforcement duties under this Act for Iolani Palace on July
- 6 1, 2012.
- 7 SECTION 5. No later than December 31, 2011, the department
- 8 of public safety shall prepare and present to the legislature a
- 9 plan, including funding projections, to assume law enforcement
- 10 functions over Iolani Palace as provided in this Act.
- 11 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
