# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PSYCHOLOGISTS.

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#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is limited
2	access to mental health care treatment services for residents
3	across the State of Hawaii. The delivery of comprehensive,
4	accessible, and affordable mental health medical care may be
5	enhanced by providing trained medical psychologists, licensed in
6	Hawaii, with limited prescriptive authority. The legislature
7	has previously authorized prescription privileges to advanced
8	practice registered nurses, optometrists, dentists, podiatrists,
9	osteopaths, and physician assistants.

years, Louisiana and New Mexico adopted legislation authorizing
prescriptive authority for appropriately trained psychologists
without regard to the service setting.

Since 2000, twenty psychologists, all born and raised in

Hawaii, have received psychopharmacological training through the

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- 1 Tripler Army Medical Center psychology training program. These
- 2 psychologists have actively collaborated with primary care
- 3 physicians to provide combined therapy and psychopharmacological
- 4 care to a medically underserved patient population at eleven
- 5 federally qualified health centers, Bay Clinic, Hana, Molokai,
- 6 Kauai, Waianae, Kalihi-Palama, Waimanalo, Koʻolauloa, West
- 7 Hawaii, Kokua Kalihi Valley, and Waikiki, as well as a native
- 8 Hawaiian healthcare system clinic located in a federally
- 9 designated medically underserved area on Molokai.
- 10 The American Psychological Association has developed a
- 11 model curriculum for a master's degree in psychopharmacology for
- 12 the education and training of prescribing psychologists.
- 13 Independent evaluations of the United States Department of
- 14 Defense Psychopharmacological Demonstration Project by the
- 15 United States General Accounting Office and the American College
- 16 of Neuropsychopharmacology have found that appropriately trained
- 17 medical psychologists prescribe safely and effectively.
- 18 The purpose of this Act is to authorize appropriately
- 19 trained and supervised licensed psychologists to prescribe
- 20 antidepressant medications for the treatment of mental illness.

- 1 SECTION 2. Chapter 465, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 "PART . PRESCRIPTION CERTIFICATION
- 5 §465-A Definitions. As used in this part, unless the
- 6 context otherwise requires:
- 7 "Antidepressant medication" means those medications
- 8 included in the United States Pharmacopeia's antidepressant
- 9 therapeutic category.
- 10 "Board" means the board of psychology established under
- section 465-4. 11
- 12 "Clinical experience" means a period of supervised clinical
- 13 training and practice involving clinical diagnoses and
- 14 interventions that are conducted and supervised as part of a
- 15 training program.
- 16 "Narcotics" means natural and synthetic opioid analgesics,
- 17 and their derivatives used to relieve pain.
- 18 "Prescription" is an order for a drug, laboratory test, or
- 19 medicine, device, or treatment, as defined by state law.
- 20 "Prescriptive authority" means the authority to prescribe,
- 21 administer, discontinue, or distribute without charge,
- 22 antidepressant medication recognized in or customarily used in

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- 1 the diagnosis, treatment, and management of individuals with
- 2 psychiatric, mental, cognitive, nervous, emotional, or
- 3 behavioral disorders, or other procedures directly related
- 4 thereto within the scope of practice of psychology in accordance
- 5 with rules adopted by the board.
- 6 "Psychologist certified to prescribe" means a licensed,
- 7 doctoral-level psychologist who has:
- 8 (1) Completed specialized education and training in
- 9 preparation for prescriptive practice;
- 10 (2) Passed an examination accepted by the board relevant
- to establishing competence for prescribing; and
- 12 (3) Received from the board a current certificate granting
- prescriptive authority, which has not been revoked or
- suspended.
- "Supervising physician" means a medically trained and
- 16 licensed physician or psychiatrist who accepts professional
- 17 responsibility for the provision of psychopharmacotherapy.
- 18 §465-B Conditional prescription certificate; application.
- 19 (a) A psychologist who applies for a conditional prescription
- 20 certificate shall demonstrate all of the following by official
- 21 transcript or other official evidence satisfactory to the board:

3	(b)	The board shall issue a conditional prescription
4	certifica	te if it finds that the applicant has met all of the
5	requireme	nts of subsection (a).
6	(c)	The conditional prescription certificate shall be
7	immediate	ly relinquished by the psychologist if the psychologist
8	no longer	meets the requirements of subsection (a).
9	§ <b>465</b>	-C Conditional prescription certificate; powers,
10	duties, a	nd responsibilities. (a) A psychologist holding a
11	condition	al prescription certificate shall:
12	(1)	Hold a current license to practice psychology in
13		Hawaii and maintain malpractice insurance;
14	(2)	Inform the board of the name of the supervising
15		physician under whose supervision the psychologist
16		will prescribe antidepressant medication; provided
17		that the psychologist shall promptly inform the board
18		of any change of the supervising physician; and
19	(3)	Maintain an ongoing collaborative relationship with
20		the doctor of medicine who oversees each patient's
21		general medical care.

- 1 (b) A psychologist holding a conditional prescription 2 certificate shall be authorized to prescribe, administer, 3 discontinue, or distribute without charge, antidepressant medication recognized in or customarily used in the diagnosis, 4 5 treatment, and management of individuals with psychiatric, 6 mental, cognitive, nervous, emotional or behavioral disorders 7 and relevant to the practice of psychology, or other procedures 8 directly related thereto within the scope of practice of 9 psychology in accordance with rules adopted by the board. 10 authorization shall be limited to services provided to patients 11 under the care of the psychologist and who are enrolled at the 12 federally qualified health center identified by the board. 13 (c) When prescribing antidepressant medication for a 14 patient, a psychologist holding a conditional prescription 15 certificate shall maintain an ongoing collaborative relationship 16 with the doctor of medicine who oversees each patient's general 17 medical care to ensure that:
- 18 (1) Necessary medical examinations are conducted;
- 19 (2) The antidepressant medication is appropriate for the
  20 patient's medical condition; and
- 21 (3) Significant changes in the patient's medical or22 psychological condition are discussed.

4	(1)	Comply with applicable state and federal laws;
5	(2)	Be identified as issued by a "psychologist certified

11	certifica	te shall not delegate prescriptive authority to any
12	person.	Records of all prescriptions shall be maintained in the
13	prescribi	ng psychologist's patient records.
14	§ <b>465</b>	-D Prescription certificate. (a) A psychologist who
15	applies f	or a prescription certificate shall demonstrate all of
16	the follo	wing by official transcript or other official evidence
17	satisfact	ory to the board:
18	(1)	A conditional prescription certificate, which includes
19		successful completion of two years of prescribing
20		antidepressant medication as certified by a
21		supervising physician;

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1	(2)	successful completion of a process of independent peer
2		review approved by the department of commerce and
3		consumer affairs;
4	(3)	A current license in good standing to practice
5		psychology in Hawaii;
6	(4)	Malpractice insurance sufficient to satisfy the rules
7		adopted by the board, that will cover the applicant as
8		a prescribing psychologist; and
9	(5)	Completion of all other requirements, as determined by
10		rules adopted by the board pursuant to chapter 91, for
11		obtaining a prescription certificate.
12	(b)	The board shall issue a prescription certificate if it
13	finds that	t the applicant has met all of the requirements of
14	subsection	n (a).
15	(c)	A psychologist with a prescription certificate may
16	prescribe	antidepressant medication if the psychologist:
17	(1)	Holds a current license to practice psychology in
18		Hawaii and maintains malpractice insurance;
19	(2)	Annually satisfies the continuing education
20		requirements for prescribing psychologists, as set by
71	(	the board which chall be no fewer than twenty hours

1		each year, at least half of which shall be in
2		pharmacology or psychopharmacology; and
3	(3)	Maintains an ongoing collaborative relationship
4	•	directly or by telecommunication with the doctor of
5		medicine who oversees each patient's general medical
6	÷	care to ensure that:
7		(A) Necessary medical examinations are conducted;
8		(B) Antidepressant medication prescribed is
9		appropriate for the patient's medical condition
10		and
11		(C) Significant changes in the patient's medical or
12		psychological condition are discussed.
13	(d)	The prescription certificate shall be immediately
14	relinquis	hed by the psychologist if the psychologist no longer
15	meets the	requirements of subsection (a).
16	§ <b>465</b>	-E Administration. (a) The board shall adopt rules
17	pursuant	to chapter 91 establishing the procedures to be
18	followed	to obtain a conditional prescription certificate, a
19	prescript	ion certificate, and renewal of a conditional
20	prescript	ion certificate and prescription certificate. The
21	board may	set reasonable application and renewal fees.

- 1 (b) The board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
- 2 establishing the grounds for denial, suspension, or revocation
- 3 of conditional prescription certificates and prescription
- 4 certificates, including provisions for suspension or revocation
- 5 of a license to practice psychology upon suspension or
- 6 revocation of a conditional prescription certificate or
- 7 prescription certificate. Actions of denial, suspension, or
- 8 revocation of a conditional prescription certificate or a
- 9 prescription certificate shall be in accordance with this
- 10 chapter.
- 11 (c) The board shall maintain current records on every
- 12 prescribing psychologist, including federal Drug Enforcement
- 13 Administration registration numbers.
- 14 (d) The board shall provide to the board of pharmacy an
- 15 annual list of psychologists holding a conditional prescription
- 16 certificate or prescription certificate that contains the
- 17 information agreed upon between the board and the board of
- 18 pharmacy. The board shall promptly provide the board of
- 19 pharmacy with the names of any psychologists who are added or
- 20 deleted from the list.
- 21 §465-F Narcotics; prohibited. This part shall not be
- 22 construed to permit a psychologist holding a conditional

3	SECTI	ON 3. Chapter 465, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by	designating sections 465-1 to 465-15 as part I,
5	entitled "	General Provisions".
6	SECTI	ON 4. Section 465-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended to	read as follows:
8	"§ <b>46</b> 5	<b>6-3 Exemptions.</b> (a) This chapter shall not apply to:
9	(1)	Any person teaching, lecturing, consulting, or
10		engaging in research in psychology insofar as the
11		activities are performed as part of or are dependent
12		upon employment in a college or university; provided
13		that the person shall not engage in the practice of
14		psychology outside the responsibilities of the
15		person's employment;
16	(2)	Any person who performs any, or any combination of the
17		professional services defined as the practice of
18		psychology under the direction of a licensed
19		psychologist in accordance with rules adopted by the
20		board; provided that the person may use the term
21		"psychological assistant", but shall not identify the

1		person's self as a psychologist or imply that the
2		person is licensed to practice psychology;
3	(3)	Any person employed by a local, state, or federal
4		government agency in a school psychologist or
5		psychological examiner position, or a position that
6		does not involve diagnostic or treatment services, but
7		only at those times when that person is carrying out
8		the functions of such government employment;
9	(4)	Any person who is a student of psychology, a
10		psychological intern, or a resident in psychology
11		preparing for the profession of psychology under
12		supervision in a training institution or facility and
13		who is designated by a title as "psychology trainee",
14		"psychology student", "psychology intern", or
15		"psychology resident", that indicates the person's
16		training status; provided that the person shall not
17		identify the person's self as a psychologist or imply
18		that the person is licensed to practice psychology;
19	(5)	Any person who is a member of another profession
20	- -	licensed under the laws of this jurisdiction to render
21		or advertise services, including psychotherapy, within
22		the scope of practice as defined in the statutes or

1	rules regulating the person's professional practice;
2	provided that, notwithstanding section 465-1, the
3	person does not represent the person's self to be a
4	psychologist or does not represent that the person is
5	licensed to practice psychology;

- (6) Any person who is a member of a mental health profession not requiring licensure; provided that the person functions only within the person's professional capacities; and provided further that the person does not represent the person to be a psychologist, or the person's services as psychological; or
- (7) Any person who is a duly recognized member of the clergy; provided that the person functions only within the person's capacities as a member of the clergy; and provided further that the person does not represent the person to be a psychologist, or the person's services as psychological.
- 18 (b) Nothing in this chapter shall in any way restrict any
  19 person from carrying on any of the psychological activities as
  20 defined in section 465-1; provided that such person does not
  21 offer psychological services as defined in this chapter except

1	as	such	activities	are	incidental	to	the	person's	lawful

- 2 occupational purpose.
- 3 (c) A person may use the title of
- 4 industrial/organizational psychologist, provided that the person
- 5 registers with the board, and:
- (1) Is professionally competent in the practice of
   industrial/organizational psychology; and
- 8 (2) Holds a doctoral degree from an accredited institution
   9 of higher education with training and education in
   10 industrial/organizational psychology, satisfactory to
- 11 the board; and
- (3) Provides psychological service or consultation toorganizations which does not involve the delivery or
- supervision of direct psychological services to
- individuals or groups of individuals, without regard
- 16 to the source or extent of payment for services
- rendered.
- 18 (d) Nothing in this chapter shall prevent the provision of
- 19 expert testimony by a psychologist who is otherwise exempted by
- 20 this chapter.
- 21 [(e) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed as
- 22 permitting the administration or prescription of drugs, or in



- 1 any way engaging in the practice of medicine as defined in the
- 2 laws of the State.] "
- 3 SECTION 5. In codifying the new sections added by
- 4 section 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 5 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 6 the new sections in this Act.
- 7 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
