A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the task force on 2 reinventing government was established in 2009 to examine the current operations and organization of state government and make 3 recommendations on making state government more efficient. 4 The 5 task force found that the department of education's existing governance and organizational structure is unwieldy and lacks 6 accountability. The task force submitted a final report to the 7 legislature that included a recommendation to restructure the 8 department of education into two major divisions, based on line 9 and staff functions, and to establish two senior deputy 10 superintendent positions - one in charge of primarily academic 11 achievement-related functions, and the other primarily 12 responsible for administrative functions. 13

14 The purpose of this Act is to implement the recommendation 15 of the task force on reinventing government to restructure the 16 department of education and establish two senior deputy 17 superintendent positions.



1 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding two new sections to part IV to be 3 appropriately designated and to read as follows: 4 "§302A-Duties of senior deputy superintendent for 5 academic achievement. The senior deputy superintendent for 6 academic achievement shall assume administrative responsibility 7 for all duties and functions assigned to the academic 8 achievement division. The specific duties and responsibilities 9 of the senior deputy superintendent for academic achievement 10 shall be established by the board, in consultation with the 11 superintendent. The senior deputy superintendent for academic 12 achievement shall report directly to the superintendent of 13 education and shall be evaluated on criteria established by the 14 board; provided that the evaluation criteria relate primarily to 15 improvements in student achievement. 16 §302A- Duties of senior deputy superintendent for 17 administration. The senior deputy superintendent for 18 administration shall assume administrative responsibility for 19 all duties and functions assigned to the administration 20 division. The specific duties and responsibilities of the 21 senior deputy superintendent for administration shall be 22 established by the board, in consultation with the

12		the legislature, and delegates to the constitutional
13		convention; provided that delegates to the
14		constitutional convention shall only be required to
15		file initial disclosures;
16	(2)	The directors and their deputies, the division chiefs,
17		the executive directors and the executive secretaries
18		and their deputies, the purchasing agents and the
19		fiscal officers, regardless of the titles by which the
20		foregoing persons are designated, of every state
21		agency and department;



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1	(3)	The permanent employees of the legislature and its
2		service agencies, other than persons employed in
3		clerical, secretarial, or similar positions;
4	(4)	The administrative director of the State, and the
5		assistants in the office of the governor and the
6		lieutenant governor, other than persons employed in
7		clerical, secretarial, or similar positions;
8	(5)	The hearings officers of every state agency and
9	•	department;
10	(6)	The president, the vice presidents, assistant vice
11		presidents, the chancellors, and the provosts of the
1 2		University of Hawaii and its community colleges;
13	(7)	The superintendent, senior deputy superintendents, the
14		deputy superintendent, the assistant superintendents,
15		the complex area superintendents, the state librarian,
16		and the deputy state librarian of the department of
17		education;
18	(8)	The administrative director and the deputy director of
19		the courts;
20	(9)	The members of every state board or commission whose
21		original terms of office are for periods exceeding one
22		year and whose functions are not solely advisory;



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1	(10) Candidates for state elective offices, including		
2	candidates for election to the constitutional		
3	convention, provided that candidates shall only be		
4	required to file initial disclosures; and		
5	(11) The administrator and assistant administrator of the		
6	office of Hawaiian affairs."		
7	SECTION 4. Section 302A-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
8	amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately		
9	inserted and to read as follows:		
10	" Academic achievement division means the academic		
11	achievement division of the department of education, established		
12	under section 302A-1102.		
13	"Administration division" means the administration division		
14	of the department of education, established under section		
15	302A-1102."		
16	SECTION 5. Section 302A-621, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
17	amended to read as follows:		
18	"§302A-621 Salary; senior deputy superintendents, deputy		
19	superintendent, assistant superintendents, complex area		
20	superintendents. The salaries of the senior deputy		
21	superintendents, the deputy superintendent, assistant		
22	superintendents, and complex area superintendents shall be set		
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1 by the board; provided that the salaries of the senior deputy 2 superintendents, deputy superintendent, assistant 3 superintendents, and the complex area superintendents shall not exceed eighty per cent of the superintendent's salary." 4 5 SECTION 6. Section 302A-1101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 amended to read as follows: 7 "§302A-1101 Department of education; board of education; 8 superintendent of education [-]; senior deputy superintendents. 9 There shall be a principal executive department to be known (a) 10 as the department of education, which shall be headed by an elected policy-making board to be known as the board of 11 12 education. The board shall have power in accordance with law to 13 formulate statewide educational policy, adopt student performance standards and assessment models, monitor school 14 15 success, [and to] appoint the superintendent of education as the 16 chief executive officer of the public school system[-], and 17 delegate the duties and functions of the department to the 18 academic achievement and administration divisions, pursuant to 19 section 302A-1102. 20 (b) The board shall appoint, and may remove, the 21 superintendent by a majority vote of its members. The 22 superintendent:



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1	(1) May be appointed without regard to the state residency		
2	provisions of section 78-1(b);		
3	(2) May be appointed for a term of up to four years; and		
4	(3) May be terminated only for cause.		
5	(c) The superintendent of education shall appoint, and may		
6	remove, two senior deputy superintendents who shall be known		
7	respectively as the senior deputy superintendent for academic		
8	achievement and the senior deputy superintendent for		
9	administration. Each senior deputy superintendent may be		
10	appointed for a term of up to four years and may be terminated		
11	only for cause. The senior deputy superintendents shall not be		
12	subject to chapter 76.		
13	[(c)] (d) The board shall invite the senior military		
14	commander in Hawaii to appoint a nonvoting military		
15	representative to the board, who shall serve for a two-year term		
16	without compensation. As the liaison to the board, the military		
17	representative shall advise the board regarding state education		
18	policies and departmental actions affecting students who are		
19	enrolled in public schools as family members of military		
20	personnel. The military representative shall carry out these		
21	duties as part of the representative's official military duties		
22	and shall be guided by applicable state and federal statutes,		
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regulations, and policies and may be removed only for cause by a
 majority vote of the members of the board.

3 [(d)] (e) The board shall appoint the charter school
4 review panel, which shall serve as the charter authorizer for
5 charter schools, with the power and duty to issue charters,
6 oversee and monitor charter schools, hold charter schools
7 accountable for their performance, and revoke charters."

8 SECTION 7. Section 302A-1102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9 amended to read as follows:

10 "[+]\$302A-1102[+] Department of education; <u>divisions;</u>
11 statewide and regional administrative services. [The department
12 shall serve as the central support system responsible for the

13 overall administration of statewide educational policy,

14 interpretation, and development of standards for compliance with

15 state and federal laws, and coordination and preparation of a

16 systemwide budget-for the public schools.] (a) The department

17 shall consist of two divisions:

18 (1) The academic achievement division shall be headed by
 19 the senior deputy superintendent for academic
 20 achievement and shall be primarily responsible for
 21 improvements in student achievement including but not
 22 limited to administering statewide educational policy,



1		managing supervisors of regional administrative units,
2		developing standards and assessments for student
3		achievement, developing curriculum, ensuring
4		compliance with state and federal laws relating to
5		curriculum, and ensuring the provision of special
6		education needs; and
7	(2)	The administration division shall be headed by the
8		senior deputy superintendent for administration and
9		shall be primarily responsible for providing quality
10		support and central services including but not limited
11		to managing all budgetary, financial, facilities,
12		human resources, transportation, food services, and
13		data technology needs of the department.
14	The board	shall delegate all duties and functions of the
15	department	to the two divisions in consultation with the
16	superinter	ndent and in accordance with the general areas of
17	responsib:	ility established for each division under this
18	subsection	n
19	(b)	The department may establish regional administrative
20	units to j	provide administrative support to the schools for
21	personnel	, fiscal, and procurement services. The regional
22	administra	ative units may also be assigned responsibility for the
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1 administration and operation of special education programs and 2 special schools."

3 SECTION 8. Section 302A-1111, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 5 "(a) Under policies established by the board, the 6 superintendent shall be designated as the chief executive 7 officer of the public school system having jurisdiction over the 8 internal organization, operation, and management of the public 9 school system, as provided by law; and shall administer programs 10 of education and public instruction throughout the State, 11 including education at the preschool, primary, and secondary 12 school levels, and such other programs as may be established by 13 law.

14 The superintendent shall advise the board in the board's 15 delegation of the duties and functions of the department to the 16 academic achievement and administration divisions, pursuant to 17 section 302A-1102."

18 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



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SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
