A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1.	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the task force on
2	reinventing government was established in 2009 to examine the
3	current operations and organization of state government and make
4	recommendations on improving the efficiency of state government.
5	The task force found that the department of education's existing
6	governance and organizational structure is unwieldy and lacks
7	accountability. The task force submitted a final report to the
8	legislature that included a recommendation to restructure the
9	department of education into two major divisions, based on line
10	and staff functions, and to establish two senior deputy
11	superintendent positions - one in charge primarily of academic
12	achievement-related functions, and the other primarily
13	responsible for administrative functions.
14	The purpose of this Act is to implement the recommendation
15	of the task force on reinventing government to restructure the
16	department of education and establish two senior deputy
17	superintendent positions.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding two new sections to part IV to be 3 appropriately designated and to read as follows: 4 "§302A- Duties of senior deputy superintendent for 5 academic achievement. The senior deputy superintendent for academic achievement shall assume administrative responsibility 6 7 for all duties and functions assigned to the academic 8 achievement division. The specific duties and responsibilities 9 of the senior deputy superintendent for academic achievement shall be established by the board, in consultation with the 10 11 superintendent. The senior deputy superintendent for academic 12 achievement shall report directly to the superintendent and 13 shall be evaluated on criteria established by the board; 14 provided that the evaluation criteria shall relate primarily to 15 improvements in student achievement. 16 §302A- Duties of senior deputy superintendent for **17** administration. The senior deputy superintendent for 18 administration shall assume administrative responsibility for 19 all duties and functions assigned to the administration 20 division. The specific duties and responsibilities of the senior deputy superintendent for administration shall be 21 established by the board, in consultation with the 22 SB605 HD1 HMS 2011-3243

- 1 superintendent. The senior deputy superintendent for
- 2 administration shall report directly to the superintendent and
- 3 shall be evaluated on criteria established by the board;
- 4 provided that the evaluation criteria shall relate primarily to
- 5 the quality of support services provided to teachers,
- 6 principals, and complex area supervisors."
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 302A-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately
- 9 inserted and to read as follows:
- 10 ""Academic achievement division" means the academic
- 11 achievement division of the department, established under
- 12 section 302A-1102.
- 13 "Administration division" means the administration division
- 14 of the department, established under section 302A-1102."
- 15 SECTION 4. Section 84-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 17 "(c) The following persons shall file annually with the
- 18 state ethics commission a disclosure of financial interests:
- 19 (1) The governor, the lieutenant governor, the members of
- the legislature, and delegates to the constitutional
- 21 convention; provided that delegates to the

1		constitutional convention shall only be required to
2		file initial disclosures;
3	(2)	The directors and their deputies, the division chiefs,
4		the executive directors and the executive secretaries
5		and their deputies, the purchasing agents and the
6		fiscal officers, regardless of the titles by which the
7		foregoing persons are designated, of every state
8		agency and department;
9	(3)	The permanent employees of the legislature and its
10		service agencies, other than persons employed in
11		clerical, secretarial, or similar positions;
12	(4)	The administrative director of the State, and the
13		assistants in the office of the governor and the
14		lieutenant governor, other than persons employed in
15		clerical, secretarial, or similar positions;
16	(5)	The hearings officers of every state agency and
17		department;
18	(6)	The president, the vice presidents, assistant vice
19		presidents, the chancellors, and the provosts of the
20		University of Hawaii and its community colleges;
21	(7)	The superintendent, the senior deputy superintendents,
22		[the deputy superintendent,] the assistant

1		superintendents, the complex area superintendents, the
2		state librarian, and the deputy state librarian of the
3		department of education;
4	(8)	The administrative director and the deputy director of
5		the courts;
6	(9)	The members of every state board or commission whose
7		original terms of office are for periods exceeding one
8		year and whose functions are not solely advisory;
9	(10)	Candidates for state elective offices, including
10		candidates for election to the constitutional
11		convention[7]; provided that candidates shall only be
12		required to file initial disclosures; and
13	(11)	The administrator and assistant administrator of the
14		office of Hawaiian affairs."
15	SECT	ION 5. Section 302A-621, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended t	o read as follows:
17	"530	2A-621 Salary; senior deputy superintendents, [deputy
18	superinte	ndent, assistant superintendents, complex area
19	superinte	ndents. The salaries of the senior deputy
20	superinte	ndents, [the deputy superintendent,] assistant
21	superinte	ndents, and complex area superintendents shall be set
22	by the bo	ard; provided that the salaries of the senior deputy
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- 1 superintendents, [deputy superintendent,] assistant
- 2 superintendents, and the complex area superintendents shall not
- 3 exceed [eighty] ninety per cent of the superintendent's salary."
- 4 SECTION 6. Section 302A-1101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "\$302A-1101 Department of education; board of education;
- 7 superintendent of education[-]; senior deputy superintendents.
- 8 (a) There shall be a principal executive department to be known
- 9 as the department of education, which shall be headed by an
- 10 [elected] appointed policy-making board to be known as the board
- 11 of education. The board shall have power in accordance with law
- 12 to formulate statewide educational policy, adopt student
- 13 performance standards and assessment models, monitor school
- 14 success, [and to] appoint the superintendent [of-education] as
- 15 the chief executive officer of the public school system [-], and
- 16 delegate the duties and functions of the department to the
- 17 academic achievement and administration divisions, pursuant to
- 18 section 302A-1102.
- 19 (b) The board shall appoint, and may remove, the
- 20 superintendent by a majority vote of its members. The
- 21 superintendent:

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- May be appointed without regard to the state residency 1 (1)2 provisions of section 78-1(b); May be appointed for a term of up to four years; and 3 (2) May be terminated only for cause. 4 (3) 5 (c) The superintendent shall appoint, and may remove, two 6 senior deputy superintendents who shall be known respectively as 7 the senior deputy superintendent for academic achievement and 8 the senior deputy superintendent for administration. 9 senior deputy superintendent shall be appointed for a term of up 10 to four years and shall be terminated only for cause. The 11 senior deputy superintendents shall not be subject to chapter 12 76. 13 [+(e)-] (d) The board shall invite the senior military 14 commander in Hawaii to appoint a nonvoting military 15 representative to the board, who shall serve for a two-year term without compensation. As the liaison to the board, the military 16 representative shall advise the board regarding state education 17 18 policies and departmental actions affecting students who are 19 enrolled in public schools as family members of military 20 personnel. The military representative shall carry out these 21 duties as part of the representative's official military duties 22 and shall be guided by applicable state and federal statutes,
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1	regulacions, and policies and may be removed only for cause by a
2	majority vote of the members of the board.
3	$[\frac{(d)}{d}]$ (e) The board shall appoint the charter school
4	review panel, which shall serve as the charter authorizer for
5	charter schools, with the power and duty to issue charters,
6	oversee and monitor charter schools, hold charter schools
7	accountable for their performance, and revoke charters."
8	SECTION 7. Section 302A-1102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended to read as follows:
10	"[+]§302A-1102[+] Department of education; divisions;
11	statewide and regional administrative services. [The department
12	shall serve as the central support system responsible for the
13	overall administration of statewide educational policy,
14	interpretation, and development of standards for compliance with
15	state and federal laws, and coordination and preparation of a
16	systemwide budget for the public schools.] (a) The department
17	shall consist of two divisions:
18	(1) The academic achievement division shall be headed by
19	the senior deputy superintendent for academic
20	achievement and shall be primarily responsible for
21	improvements in student achievement including
22	administering statewide educational policy, managing

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1		supervisors of regional administrative units,
2		developing standards and assessments for student
3		achievement, developing curriculum, ensuring
4		compliance with state and federal laws relating to
5		curriculum, and ensuring the provision of special
6		education needs; and
7	(2)	The administration division shall be headed by the
8		senior deputy superintendent for administration and
9		shall be primarily responsible for providing quality
10		support and central services including managing all
11		budgetary, financial, facilities, human resources,
12		transportation, food services, and data technology
13		needs of the department.
14	The board	shall delegate all duties and functions of the
15	departmen	t to the two divisions in consultation with the
16	superinte	ndent and in accordance with the general areas of
17	responsib	ility established for each division under this
18	subsection	<u>n.</u>
19	<u>(b)</u>	The department may establish regional administrative
20	units to	provide administrative support to the schools for
21	personnel	, fiscal, and procurement services. The regional
22	administr	ative units may also be assigned responsibility for the
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- 1 administration and operation of special education programs and
- 2 special schools."
- 3 SECTION 8. Section 302A-1111, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 5 "(a) Under policies established by the board, the
- 6 superintendent shall be designated as the chief executive
- 7 officer of the public school system having jurisdiction over the
- 8 internal organization, operation, and management of the public
- 9 school system, as provided by law; and shall administer programs
- 10 of education and public instruction throughout the State,
- 11 including education at the preschool, primary, and secondary
- 12 school levels, and such other programs as may be established by
- 13 law.
- 14 The superintendent shall advise the board in the board's
- 15 delegation of the duties and functions of the department to the
- 16 academic achievement and administration divisions, pursuant to
- 17 section 302A-1102."
- 18 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

DOE; Restructuring

Description:

Restructures the Department of Education into two major divisions - the academic achievement division and the administration division - and establishes two senior deputy superintendent positions to head the divisions. Changes the salary cap for certain superintendent positions to ninety per cent, rather than eighty per cent of the superintendent's salary. Effective July 1, 2050. (SB605 HD1)
