A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE KAHOOLAWE ISLAND RESERVE COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 6K-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§6K-5 Commission. (a) There is established the
4 Kaho'olawe island reserve commission to be placed within the
5 department of land and natural resources for administrative
6 purposes as provided in section 26-35. The commission shall
7 consist of [seven] five members to be appointed in the manner
8 and to serve for the terms provided in section 26-34[7], except
9 as provided in subsection (e); provided that:

10 (1) One member shall be [a member-of] appointed by the
 11 governor from a list provided by the Protect Kaho'olawe
 12 Ohana;

13 (2) [Two members] <u>One member</u> shall be appointed by the
14 governor [from a list provided by the Protect
15 Kahoʻolawe Ohana;] from a list provided by native

16 Hawaiian organizations;

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1	(3)	One member shall be a trustee or representative of the
2		office of Hawaiian affairs;
3	(4)	One member shall be a county official appointed by the
4		governor from a list provided by the mayor of the
5		county of Maui; and
6	(5)	One member shall be the chairperson of the board of
7		land and natural resources[; and
8	-(6) -	One member shall be appointed by the governor from a
9		list provided by native Hawaiian organizations].
10	(b)	The governor shall appoint the chairperson from among
11	the members of the commission.	
12	(c)	The members of the commission shall serve without pay
13	but shall	be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses,
14	including	travel expenses, incurred in carrying out their
15	duties.	
16	(d)	Any action taken by the commission shall be approved
17	by a simp	le majority of its members. [Four] <u>Three</u> members shall
18	constitute	e a quorum to do business.
19	(e)	Notwithstanding section 26-34, any person appointed to
20	the commi	ssion pursuant to subsection (a) who has completed two
21	consecuti	ve terms as a member of the commission shall not be
22	eligible	to be appointed to the commission for a period of four
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1 years commencing the last day of the second consecutive term of 2 the person's service as a member of the commission; provided 3 that the person shall be eligible to be appointed to the commission four or more years after the last day of the second 4 5 consecutive term of the person's previous service. 6 [(c)] (f) The commission, without regard to the 7 requirements of chapter 76, may hire employees necessary to 8 perform its duties." 9 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 12

Kahoolawe Island Reserve Commission

Description:

Reduces the number of members of the Kahoolawe Island Reserve Commission from seven to five. Requires one member to be appointed by the governor from a list provided by the Protect Kahoolawe Ohana. Requires one member to be appointed by the governor from a list provided by native Hawaiian organizations. Mandates a 4-year wait for reappointment to the commission for any member who has completed two consecutive terms. (SD1)
