### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOTING.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the citizens of
Hawaii do not have an absolute constitutional right to vote.
The state constitution allows a citizen to vote if that citizen
is a voter registered as provided by law. In the United States,
voting is a privilege granted to citizens through the enactment
of laws.

7 The legislature further finds that citizens have an inherent right to vote as part of their responsibility as 8 9 citizens of Hawaii and this right should not be hindered without 10 The right to vote is necessary to enable citizens just cause. to govern through a representative form of government. 11 Therefore, the legislature finds that barriers to voting should 12 be removed and citizens should be encouraged to exercise this 13 14 right.

15 One of the barriers to voting is the thirty-day voter 16 registration requirement. Voter-friendly initiatives, such as 17 election day voter registration, should be implemented.

21	make them	more likely to vote.

1	The purpose of this Act is to allow voters to register on	
2	the day of an election.	
3	SECTION 2. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended	
4	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to	
5	read as follows:	
6	" <u>§11-</u> Election day voter registration. (a)	
7	Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, an individual who is	
8	eligible to vote may register on the day of an election by:	
9	(1) Appearing in person at the polling place for the	
10	precinct in which the voter maintains residency;	
11	(2) Completing a voter registration application;	
12	(3) Making an oath on a form prescribed by the chief	
13	election officer; and	
14	(4) Providing proof of residency;	
15	provided that in the case of an election conducted by mail, an	
16	individual who is eligible to vote may register at the walk-in	
17	locations in the same manner as prescribed in paragraphs (1)	
18	through (4).	
19	(b) An individual may prove residency for purposes of this	
20	section by presenting:	
21	(1) A valid Hawaii driver's license or Hawaii state	
22	identification card; or

1	(2) Any documentation approved by the chief election
2	officer.
3	(c) No precinct official shall receive the vote of any
4	individual who is not registered pursuant to subsection (a) or
5	section 11-15.
6	(d) The chief election officer or the chief election
7	officer's designee shall maintain a record of the number of
8	individuals who registered to vote on election day and voted, as
9	well as the number of individuals who attempted to register on
10	election day, but were unable to provide proof of residency
11	pursuant to subsection (b). The record shall be included with
12	the election returns for each precinct.
13	(e) The chief election officer shall establish rules
14	pursuant to chapter 91, as necessary to carry out this section."
15	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
