A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE GOVERNMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a centralized system
- 2 of state government provides for efficient coordination of
- 3 government functions and services, especially for a population
- 4 spread out over separate islands. However, issues relating to
- 5 accessibility and delivery of government information, services,
- 6 and proceedings to residents living on the neighbor islands as
- 7 well as rural Oahu remain an ongoing challenge, in part because
- 8 of the centralized location of state government in Honolulu's
- 9 urban core.
- 10 The legislature further finds that the residents of Hawaii,
- 11 Maui, Molokai, Lanai, Kauai, Niihau, and rural Oahu are
- 12 disadvantaged because of their location away from the seat of
- 13 government in Honolulu. This is true even though advancements
- 14 in technology, especially in the field of telecommunications,
- 15 have significantly reduced physical distance as a limitation on
- 16 the ability of these residents to access government information,
- 17 personnel, and proceedings.

1	The legislature believes it is the responsibility of		
2	government, through its executive, legislative, and judicial		
3	branches, to ensure that the residents of all islands have fair		
4	access to government information, services, and proceedings. To		
5	this end, the governor may find a statewide fair access		
6	commission useful, as it was when this type of commission was		
7	last convened in 1989. Moreover, the joint legislative access		
8	committee, statutorily created in 1996, has similar duties and		
9	thus is the most appropriate body to recommend ways to ensure		
10	fair access to legislative proceedings and information.		
11	The purpose of this Act is to:		
12	(1) Authorize the governor to establish a fair access		
13	commission; and		
14	(2) Require both the fair access commission and the joint		
15	legislative access committee to review, evaluate, and		
16	make recommendations for improving the level of access		
17	by neighbor island and rural Oahu residents to		
18	proceedings, information, and services of government.		
19	SECTION 2. Chapter 27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended		
20	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to		
21	read as follows:		

1	<u>§27-</u> <u>Fair access to state government.</u> (a) The office
2	of the governor shall be responsible to ensure that residents
3	throughout the State have fair access to government information,
4	services, and proceedings.
5	(b) Pursuant to subsection (a), the governor may appoint a
6	statewide fair access commission composed of representatives
7	from all the islands in the State to review, evaluate, and make
8	recommendations for improving the level of access to government
9	by residents on the neighbor islands and rural Oahu.
10	(c) The legislature also shall be responsible for ensuring
11	fair access to information, services, and proceedings of the
12	legislative branch through programs that enable residents
13	statewide to have access to audio and video broadcasts of
14	legislative proceedings, legislative documents, and public
15	education and other services through technologies that allow
16	access by residents on all islands in the State.
17	(d) The judiciary also shall be responsible for ensuring
18	fair access to information, services, and proceedings of the
19	judicial branch; provided that the judiciary shall determine
20	which records are not subject to disclosure under the provisions
21	of chapter 92F."

1	SECTI	ON 3. Section 21D-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to	read as follows:
3	" [+] s	21D-6 Joint legislative access committee.[] There
4	is establi	shed the joint legislative access committee which
5	shall be c	composed of members of the legislature. The president
6	of the sen	ate and the speaker of the house of representatives
7	shall each	appoint a co-chair and two members or more to the
8	committee,	one of whom shall be a member of the minority party.
9	The c	committee shall:
10	(1)	Oversee the staff and operations of the legislative
11		broadcast project, and recommend policies for the
12		project which shall be adopted by concurrent
13		resolution; [and]
14	(2)	Review the operations of the public access room,
15		legislative internet project, and other public access
16		projects of the legislature and recommend policies for
17		these projects to the president of the senate and the
18		speaker of the house of representatives $[-]$; and
19	(3)	Review, evaluate, and make recommendations to the
20		presiding officers of the house and senate for
21		improving the level of access to proceedings.

3	SECTION 4. Section 27-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
4	amended to	o read as follows:		
5	"§27	-1 Functions of statewide concern. The purpose of the		
6	chapter i	s to fix responsibility for certain functions, which		
7	are of sta	atewide concern, in the state government. These		
8	functions	which are declared to be state functions are as		
9	follows:			
10	(1)	Planning, construction, improvement and maintenance of		
11	•	public school facilities and grounds and the		
12		transportation of school children; provided that		
13		nothing in this paragraph shall preclude the several		
14		counties from expending their own funds to supplement		
15		state funds;		
16	(2)	Burial of indigents;		
17	(3)	Planning, construction, improvement, maintenance, and		
18		operation of public hospitals and other public health		
19		and medical facilities;		
20	(4)	Rendering of medical treatment and hospitalization		
21		services to state and county pensioners;		
22	(5)	Administration and operation of district courts; and		
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(6) Providing information [and], services, and access to
government proceedings to the public through joint
cooperation with the several counties[-] and a program
to ensure fair access for residents living on the
neighbor islands and in rural Oahu."
SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
