BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 84-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$84-11 Gifts. (a) [No] Except as provided in subsection
- 4 (b), no legislator or employee shall solicit, accept, or
- 5 receive, directly or indirectly, any gift, whether in the form
- 6 of money, service, loan, travel, entertainment, hospitality,
- 7 thing, or promise, or in any other form, under circumstances in
- 8 which it can reasonably be inferred that the gift is intended to
- 9 influence the legislator or employee in the performance of the
- 10 legislator's or employee's official duties or is intended as a
- 11 reward for any official action on the legislator's or employee's
- **12** part.
- 13 (b) A legislator or employee may accept an invitation or
- 14 ticket for a charitable event from a charitable entity, whether
- 15 or not the charitable entity is the host of the charitable
- 16 event.

1 "Charitable entity" means an entity that has received 2 recognition of tax exempt status under section 501(c)(3) through 3 (c)(6) or section 509(a)(1) through (a)(4) of the Internal 4 Revenue Code. "Charitable event" means a fundraiser sponsored by a 5 6 charitable entity that is held specifically for the purpose of 7 raising money for a specific beneficial purpose." 8 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
