A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ETHICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 84-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

"§84-11 Gifts. (a) [No] Except as provided in subsection 3 (b), no legislator or employee shall solicit, accept, or 4 receive, directly or indirectly, any gift, whether in the form 5 6 of money, service, loan, travel, entertainment, hospitality, thing, or promise, or in any other form, under circumstances in 1 which it can reasonably be inferred that the gift is intended to 8 influence the legislator or employee in the performance of the 9 10 legislator's or employee's official duties or is intended as a reward for any official action on the legislator's or employee's 11 12 part.

13 (b) A legislator or employee may accept an invitation or 14 ticket for a charitable event from a charitable entity, whether 15 or not the charitable entity is the host of the charitable 16 event.

17 (c) For purposes of this section:

1	"Charitable entity" means an entity that has received
2	recognition of tax exempt status under section 501(c)(3) of the
3	Internal Revenue Code.
4	"Charitable event" means a fundraiser sponsored by a
5	charitable entity that is held specifically for the purpose of
6	raising money for a specific beneficial purpose."
7	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
