BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 803-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

4 Immigration and Customs Enforcement, Federal Bureau of

6 [Service or Citizenship and Immigration Services]; arrest

7 powers. An officer of the <u>United States Immigration and Customs</u> 8 <u>Enforcement, Federal Bureau of Investigation, or</u> United States 9 Customs and Border Protection [Service or the Citizenship and 10 <u>Immigration Services</u>], without a warrant, may arrest a person 11 if:

12 (1) The officer is on duty;

13 (2) One or more of the following situations exists:
14 (A) The person commits an assault or other crime
15 involving physical harm, defined and punishable
16 under chapter 707, against the officer or against
17 any other person in the presence of the officer;
