RELATING TO LOANS FOR TEACHERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	" <u>§302A-</u> Rural area teachers' home loan program		
5	subaccount. (a) There is established within the teachers'		
6	housing revolving fund, a rural area teachers' home loan program		
7	subaccount, into which shall be deposited:		
8	(1) Legislative appropriations;		
9	(2) Federal funds, if available; and		
10	(3) All principal payments, fees, penalties, and any other		
11	proceeds derived by the department pursuant to this		
12	section.		
13	The department shall expend the moneys from the rural area		
14	teachers' home loan program to provide interest-free home		
15	purchase loans to qualified teachers.		
16	(b) Loans made under this section shall be interest-free		
17	and used by the qualified teacher exclusively for the purchase		
18	of a home, including an apartment, townhouse, or condominium, in		
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1	the rural	area in which the teacher is employed by the
2	departmen	t. In addition, loans made under this section shall
3	be:	
4	(1)	Repaid under a payment plan specified by the
5		department; provided that additional payments, in any
6		sum, or the payment of the entire principal, may be
7		made at any time within the period of the loan;
8	(2)	Secured in a manner to be determined by the
9		department; and
10	(3)	Subject to penalties for delinquency or late payments
11		as specified by the department as provided in
12		subsection (c).
13	(c)	During the period of the loan, if at any time a person
14	receiving	the loan fails to comply with the requirements
15	establish	ed in the definition of "qualified teacher" under this
16	section,	the loan shall be considered forfeit and the principal
17	amount ou	tstanding, plus penalties, shall become due and
18	payable.	If the principal amount outstanding and penalties are
19	not remit	ted, the department may initiate foreclosure
20	proceedin	gs on the home purchased through the proceeds from the
21	loan. Th	is section shall not apply in cases where the qualified
22	teacher f	ails to comply with the requirements because of
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1	circumsta	nces beyond the qualified teacher's control, as
2	determine	d by the department.
3	(d)	Loans provided under this section shall not exceed
4	\$	per qualified teacher. Each qualified teacher shall
5	receive n	o more than one loan under this section.
6	(e)	The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
7	to establ	ish eligibility requirements for teachers applying for
8	<u>a loan un</u>	der this section.
9	(f)	For purposes of this section:
10	"Qua	lified rural area school" means a public or private
11	primary s	chool, secondary or middle school, high school, college
12	preparato	ry school, or start-up charter school that:
13	(1)	Has demonstrated difficulty in hiring and retaining
14	•	teachers, according to standards and criteria
15		specified by the department; and
16	(2)	Is located in a rural area that is characterized by a
17		low population density and the absence of "city-like"
18		concentration of structures, streets, and urban
19		services; provided that the department may establish
20		more specific criteria and standards to further define
21		"rural area".



1	"Qua	lified teacher" means a teacher, working at least forty
2	hours per	week in a qualified rural area school, who fulfills
3	the eligi	bility requirements, if any, specified under subsection
4	<u>(e).</u> "	
5	SECT	ION 2. Section 302A-832, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by	y amending its title and subsection (a) to read as
7	follows:	
8	" [-{] :	§302A-832[]] Teachers' housing program;
9	administra	ation. (a) The department shall administer the
10	teachers'	housing program under this subpart. The department
11	shall:	
12	(1)	Administer the teachers' housing revolving fund under
13		section 302A-833;
14	(2)	Administer the rural area teachers' home loan program
15		under section 302A- ;
16	[(2)]	(3) Provide annual statements under section 302A-834;
17	[(3)]	(4) Conduct annual reviews of units under section
18		302A-835; and
19	[-(4) -]	(5) Perform any other duty necessary to effectuate
20		this subpart.
21	(b)	The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
22	to effectu	late this subpart."

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1	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
3	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and
4	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
5	year 2012-2013 to be deposited into the rural area teachers loan
6	program subaccount of the teachers' housing revolving fund.
7	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the rural area
8	teachers' house loan program subaccount of the teachers' housing
9	revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may
10	be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and the same sum or so
11	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for
12	the purposes of this fund.
13	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
14	of education for the purposes of this Act.
15	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
