A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE SUNSHINE PROVISIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to require the
legislature to follow certain fundamental principles of the
sunshine law in conducting its business, including:

4	(1)	Requiring each legislative house to conduct a public
5		hearing on proposed rules prior to adoption;
6	(2)	Requiring that correspondence, including governor's
7		messages, submitted on a measure be considered as
8		testimony on the measure;
9	(3)	Instituting a forty-eight-hour public notice
10	•	requirement, excluding Sundays and state holidays, for
11		public hearings to ensure reasonable opportunity for
12		public input and testimony on legislation;
13	(4)	Requiring that all floor votes, except on first
14		reading, be printed on the order of the day before
15		consideration; and
16	(5)	Requiring a majority vote to suspend a legislative
17		rule.

SECTION 2. Chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 1 2 by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read 3 as follows: 4 "PART LEGISLATIVE PROVISIONS 5 §92-Testimony and public notice. (a) Public notice 6 shall be provided forty-eight hours before a public hearing. 7 The forty-eight-hour period shall exclude Sundays and state 8 holidays. A public hearing shall be conducted on all major 9 substantive provisions in legislation to be adopted. All correspondence submitted on a measure, including 10 (b) governor's messages, shall be considered as testimony on that 11 12 measure. Rules of the legislature. After a public hearing, 13 §92-14 each legislative house shall adopt official rules and policies by a majority vote. A majority vote shall be taken before 15 suspending any legislative rule. 16 Agenda and voting. All items to be voted on by 17 §92-18 each legislative house, except for first reading votes on bills, 19 shall be printed on the order of the day before consideration, 20 including votes to agree to amendments from the other house." SECTION 3. Section 92-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 21 22. amended to read as follows:

1	"§92-10 Legislative branch; applicability.
2	Notwithstanding any provisions contained in this chapter to the
3	contrary, open meeting requirements, and provisions regarding
4	enforcement, penalties, and sanctions, as they are to relate to
5	the state legislature or to any of its members shall be [such as
6	shall be] as from time to time prescribed by the respective
7	rules and procedures of the senate and the house of
8	representatives, which rules and procedures shall take
9	precedence over this part $[+]$, except as provided in part of
10	this chapter. Similarly, provisions relating to notice, agenda
11	and minutes of meetings, and [such] other requirements as may be
12	necessary, shall also be governed by the respective rules and
13	procedures of the senate and the house of representatives."
14	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
15	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
