A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE FIRE COUNCIL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state fire
 council needs to employ staff positions to accomplish its
 statutory duties and responsibilities. The state fire council,
 among other things:

5 (1) Appoints advisory committees comprised of
6 representatives from each county fire department to
7 assist in drafting the state fire code;

8 (2) Assists in coordinating statewide training, data
9 collection, and contingency planning needs for
10 firefighters;

11 (3) Prescribes standard procedures and forms relating to
12 inspections, investigations, and reporting of fires;
13 (4) Approves plans for cooperation among the county fire
14 departments;

15 (5) Advises the governor and the legislature with respect
16 to fire prevention and protection, life safety, and
17 any other functions or activities for which the

1 various county fire departments are generally 2 responsible; 3 (6) Serves as a point of contact through which all 4 applications to the federal government for federal 5 grant assistance for fire-related projects shall be 6 made and administers those federal grants; 7 (7) Coordinates statewide fire and life safety training, 8 education, and inspection of state buildings and 9 facilities; and 10 Prescribes standard procedures and forms relating to (8) 11 inspections, investigations, and reporting of fires. 12 Currently, the state fire council has one part-time administrative assistant position, and there is no statutory 13 14 provision for the hiring of staff. More positions are needed 15 for the state fire council to fulfill its statutory mandate and 16 to protect the public safety. 17 The purpose of this Act is to allow the state fire council to employ an administrator and administrative assistant. 18 19 SECTION 2. Chapter 132, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 21 and to read as follows:
