A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SMALL BUSINESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii compliance 2 express is an electronic system that allows vendors doing 3 business with state or county agencies to quickly and easily 4 obtain proof that they are compliant with applicable laws. 5 Hawaii compliance express expedites a vendor's ability to 6 furnish proof of compliance with the requirements of section 7 103D-310(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes, by providing an online 8 "Certificate of Vendor Compliance" for the business entity. 9 This single certificate eliminates the need to obtain individual 10 hard copies of certificates from the Internal Revenue Service 11 and department of taxation, department of labor and industrial 12 relations, and department of commerce and consumer affairs. The 13 service includes real time monitoring of the vendor's status of 14 compliance with each agency and automatically notifies the 15 vendor by email any time the compliance status is changed. 16 The Hawaii compliance express was launched in September 17 2005, and has grown from one hundred seventy-nine vendors the 18 first year to forty-one hundred seventeen vendors through 2011-1581 SB758 SD1 SMA.doc

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1 mid-December 2010. The department of accounting and general 2 services accounting division estimates that approximately 3 seventy per cent of invoices processed for payment through their 4 office use the Hawaii compliance express certificate, versus the 5 three paper certificates. The minimal cost to a vendor to use 6 the Hawaii compliance express is \$12 per year, a decrease from \$15 when the system was launched in 2005. 7 8 Under current law, vendors must provide proof of compliance 9 in order to receive a contract greater than \$15,000 with state and county government entities in Hawaii. 10 11 In 2010, the senate committee on economic development and 12 technology and the house committee on economic revitalization,

13 business, and military affairs convened an informal small 14 business discussion group to address the most critical issues facing the small business sectors within Hawaii's economy. 15 16 Representatives from the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii, 17 construction and trades industries, community nonprofits, the 18 agricultural sector, food and restaurant industries, retailing, 19 the science and technology sector, the commercial transportation 20 industry, and interested stakeholders developed a package of 21 bills that address the most pressing problems facing Hawaii's 22 small business community.

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The purpose of this Act is to support the findings of the
 small business working group and recommendations to extend the
 use of Hawaii compliance express for small business vendors,
 affording them the same savings of time and money in the
 contracting process.

6 SECTION 2. Section 103D-310, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

8 "(c) All offerors, upon award of contract, shall comply 9 with all laws governing entities doing business in the State, 10 including chapters 237, 383, 386, 392, and 393. Offerors shall 11 produce documents to the procuring officer to demonstrate 12 compliance with this subsection. Any offeror making a false affirmation or certification under this subsection shall be 13 14 suspended from further offerings or awards pursuant to section 15 103D-702. The procuring officer shall verify compliance with 16 this subsection for all contracts awarded pursuant to sections 17 103D-302, 103D-303, 103D-304, and 103D-306[+], and for all 18 contracts of \$2,500 or greater awarded pursuant to section 19 103D-305; provided that the attorney general may waive the 20 requirements of this subsection for contracts for legal services 21 if the attorney general certifies in writing that comparable legal services are not available in this State." 22



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SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
