### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 15-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

3 "§15-6 Return envelope, ballot envelope; instructions[-]; 4 **explanations.** (a) The clerk shall provide the absentee voter 5 with the ballots, ballot envelopes, and a return envelope which 6 shall contain a statement to be subscribed to by the voter which 7 affirms the fact that the voter is the person voting, the 8 instruction that the voter's ballot will be valid only if the 9 affirmation statement is signed, and any other information 10 prescribed by the rules promulgated by the chief election 11 officer.

12 (b) In addition to any requirements established by the 13 state constitution, when a question or issue is placed on the 14 ballot, the chief election officer shall prepare a clear 15 explanation of each question or issue which the clerk shall 16 provide to the absentee voter."

SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketedand stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
