A BILL FOR AN ACT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 302A-801, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

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1 (6) Issue a license to a teacher with a valid out-of-state 2 license who has passed similar, though not identical, 3 tests in basic skills, pedagogy, and subject matter to 4 those required for licensure in the State; provided 5 that upon the effective date of the adoption of 6 administrative rules addressing the recognition of 7 out-of-state teacher licenses, those administrative rules shall supersede the requirements of this 8 9 paragraph." SECTION 3. Section 302A-805, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 11 amended to read as follows: 12 "§302A-805 Teachers; license required; renewals. 13 Beginning July 1, 2002, all new licenses shall be issued by the 14 board. No person shall serve as a half-time or full-time 15 teacher in a public school without first having obtained a 16 license from the board under this subpart. All licenses issued 17 by the board shall be valid only for the fields specified on the 18 licenses and shall be renewable every five years for a standard 19 license and every ten years for an advanced license if the 20 individual continues to: 21 Satisfy the board's licensing standards and submits (1)

5	SECTION 4. Section 302A-805.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"[[]§302A-805.5[]] Approval of teacher education programs;
8	professional development of teachers. The board shall be
9	responsible for approving teacher education programs that have
10	attained national accreditation from a teacher education
11	accrediting body approved by the United States Department of
12	Education and that meet the standards established by the board.
13	The board may engage in efforts relating to the improvement of
14	instruction through teacher education and professional
15	development, and to attract qualified candidates for teacher
16	training from among the high school graduates of the State."
17	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
18	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
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This Act shall take effect upon its approval. SECTION 6.

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Report Title: Teacher Standards; Training

Description:

Allows teacher and educational officer board members to continue to serve out up to three consecutive three-year terms even if they retire during a term. Adds training in dealing with bullying of students and training on revised student and teacher performance standards to the requirements for license renewal. Extends the term of the renewable advanced licensed from five to ten years. Creates a new career and technical education license available to those with appropriate industry experience with no bachelor's degree. Adds national accreditation to the requirement for state approval of teacher education programs.
