#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CLIMATE CHANGE TASK FORCE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION	1. Act 20, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, is
2	amended by am	mending section 2 to read as follows:

4		resources, and the economy of the State, including
5		impacts on:

7		(B) Shoreline erosion;

1	(3)	The director of transportation or the director's	
2		designee;	
3	(4)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural	
4		resources, or the chairperson's designee;	
5	(5)	The vice-director of civil defense of the department	
6		of defense or the vice-director's designee;	
7	(6)	One member appointed by each of the mayors of Hawaii,	
8		Honolulu, Kauai, and Maui counties;	
9	(7)	Three members appointed by the president of the	
10		senate, of whom one shall be from an environmental	
11		organization;	
1 <b>2</b>	(8)	Three members appointed by the speaker of the house of	
13		representatives, of whom one shall be from an	
14		environmental organization;	
15	(9)	The director of the Center for Island Climate	
16		Adaptation and Policy at the University of Hawaii at	
17		Manoa; and	
18	(10)	One member from the Joint Institute for Marine and	
19		Atmospheric Research to be appointed by its	
20		administrative board.	
21	Members of the task force shall be exempt from section		
22	26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and serve without compensation,		



1	but shall	be reimbursed for expenses necessary for the	
2	performance of their duties, including travel expenses.		
3	(c)	The task force shall:	
4	(1)	Submit a preliminary report of its findings and	
5		recommendations, including any proposed legislation,	
6		to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to	
7		the convening of the regular session of $[2010; 2012;$	
8		and	
9	(2)	Submit a final report of its findings and	
10		recommendations, including any proposed legislation,	
11		to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to	
12		the convening of the regular session of [2011.] 2013.	
13	(d)	The office of planning shall provide administrative	
14	and clerical support required by the task force.		
15	(e)	The task force shall cease to exist on June 30,	
16	[ <del>2011.</del> ] <u>2013.</u> "		
17	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the tourism		
18	special fund the sum of \$50,000 or so much thereof as may be		
19	necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and the same sum or so much		
20	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the		
21	purposes of this Act.		



The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
 planning for the purposes of this Act.

3 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and
6 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
7 year 2012-2013 for the purposes of this Act.

8 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of9 planning for the purposes of this Act.

10 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of any portion of the 11 environmental response, energy, and food security tax collected 12 and allocated to the climate change task force, pursuant to 13 section 243-3.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, one hundred per cent 14 of that portion or so much thereof as may be necessary for 15 fiscal year 2011-2012 and the same sum or so much thereof as may 16 be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the purposes of this 17 Act.

18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of 19 planning for the purposes of this Act.

20 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011;
 provided that section 1 shall take effect on June 29, 2011.
