A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CERTAIN FUNDS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 304A-2252, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "[{]§304A-2252[}] Child care programs [revolving] special 4 fund. There is established a child care programs [revolving] 5 special fund for the operation of child care programs established under section 304A-116 and the construction and 6 7 renovation of child care centers established by the University 8 of Hawaii. Fees charged for child care at child care programs, 9 proceeds from donations to the university for child care programs, and proceeds from loans or other instruments of 10 11 indebtedness for the construction or renovation of child care 12 centers shall be deposited into the [revolving] special fund. 13 Expenditures from the [revolving] special fund shall be made for 14 the operation of child care programs and payment of principal 15 and interest on obligations incurred for the construction or 16 renovation of child care centers."

17 SECTION 2. Section 304A-2253, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 amended as follows:

2	" (a)	There is established a University of Hawaii research
3	and traini	ng revolving fund into which shall be deposited one
4	hundred pe	r cent of the total amount of indirect overhead
5	revenues g	enerated by the university from research and training

7	hundred pe	r cent of the revenues deposited in the fund for:
8	(1)	Research and training purposes that may result in
9		additional research and training grants and contracts;
10	(2)	Facilitating research and training at the university;

12	(3)	Further deposit into the discoveries and inventions
13		revolving fund [and the University of Hawaii housing
14		assistance revolving fund]."
15	2.	By amending subsection (c) to read:
16	"(C)	Notwithstanding sections 304A-107[7] and
17	[[]304A-22	54[], and [304A-2258]] to the contrary, the board of
18	regents or	its designee, may establish a separate account within
19	the resear	ch and training revolving fund for the purpose of
20	providing	advance funding to meet reimbursable costs incurred in
21	connection	with federally financed research and training
22	projects.	Any reimbursement received as a result of providing
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advance funding shall be deposited into the research and
 training revolving fund to be used for the purpose of meeting
 reimbursable costs incurred in connection with federally
 financed projects."

5 SECTION 3. Section 304A-2254, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended to read as follows:

7 "[+]§304A-2254[+] Discoveries and inventions revolving fund. There is established a discoveries and inventions 8 9 [revolving] special fund into which shall be deposited a portion 10 of the total indirect overhead funds generated by the university for research and training purposes in the prior fiscal year, as 11 12 determined by the board of regents. Appropriations by the legislature subject to the approval of the governor, proceeds 13 14 from the commercial exploitation of inventions and intellectual property developed at the university, gifts, donations, fees 15 16 collected, and grants from public agencies and private persons 17 may also be deposited into the special fund for the purposes of 18 supporting innovation and research commercialization and the 19 patenting, copyrighting, licensing, and marketing of 20 discoveries, inventions, and technologies developed at the 21 university. The special fund shall be used to develop 22 technologies that have potential commercial value, support the



administration of technology transfer activities, and facilitate
 economic development through education and research undertaken
 at the university."

4 SECTION 4. Section 304A-2259, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5 amended to read as follows:

6 "[{]\$304A-2259[{] University of Hawaii alumni [revolving] 7 special fund. There is established the University of Hawaii 8 alumni [revolving] special fund into which shall be deposited 9 funds and proceeds received by the university from alumni 10 activities and donations from alumni. Funds deposited into this 11 [revolving] special fund may be expended by the university for 12 all costs associated with conducting alumni affairs, activities, 13 and programs for the university system, including but not 14 limited to expenses for honoraria, hotel and room rentals, food 15 and refreshment, printing and mailing, banners and signs, 16 plaques and awards, airfare and per diem, leis, rental of 17 audiovisual, musical, and stage equipment, and activity supplies 18 and materials, without regard to statutory competitive bidding 19 requirements."

20 SECTION 5. Section 304A-2261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 21 amended to read as follows:



1 "[+]\$304A-2261[+] University of Hawaii at Manoa 2 intercollegiate athletics [revolving] special fund and 3 University of Hawaii at Hilo intercollegiate athletics 4 [revolving] special fund. Notwithstanding any other law to the 5 contrary, there are established the University of Hawaii at 6 Manoa intercollegiate athletics [revolving] special fund and the 7 University of Hawaii at Hilo intercollegiate athletics 8 [revolving] special fund for the intercollegiate athletic 9 programs of the University of Hawaii at Manoa and the University 10 of Hawaii at Hilo, which shall be used to receive, deposit, 11 disburse, and account for funds from the activities of the 12 intercollegiate athletic programs. The university may establish 13 appropriate charges for activities related to its athletic 14 programs and the use of its athletic facilities, the proceeds from which shall be deposited into these [revolving] special 15 16 funds.

17 The university shall maintain the financial integrity and 18 viability of these [revolving] special funds, including the 19 maintenance of an adequate reserve to cope with the various 20 factors that impact the revenue structure of an intercollegiate 21 athletic program."



SECTION 6. Section 304A-2262, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]\$304A-2262[+] Animal research farm, Waialee, Oahu 4 [**revolving**] **special fund**. There is established the animal 5 research farm, Waialee, Oahu [revolving] special fund for the 6 animal research farm, Waialee, Oahu, operated by the college of 7 tropical agriculture and human resources of the University of 8 Hawaii, into which shall be deposited the receipts from fees 9 realized from the sale of livestock, services, and supplies. 10 Funds deposited into this [revolving] special fund shall be expended for animal research, and services and supplies related 11 12 thereto."

13 SECTION 7. Section 304A-2271, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended to read as follows:

15 "[+]\$304A-2271[+] University of Hawaii-Hilo theatre 16 [revolving] special fund. There is established the University 17 of Hawaii-Hilo theatre [revolving] special fund, which shall 18 consist of admissions, advertising sales, corporate 19 sponsorships, marketing, merchandising, donations, fund-raising, 20 fees, charges, and other moneys collected in conjunction with 21 the University of Hawaii-Hilo theatre program. The [revolving] 22 special fund shall be administered by the office of



1 administrative affairs of the University of Hawaii at Hilo.
2 Funds may be expended for all costs associated with the theatre
3 program, including artists' fees, production costs, personnel
4 costs, honoraria, per diem, hotel and room rentals, food and
5 refreshments, printing and mailing, advertising, airfare, leis,
6 rental or purchase of equipment, and theater supplies and
7 materials."

8 SECTION 8. Section 304A-2158, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9 repealed.

10 ["[\$304A-2158] Western Governors University special fund. There is established a Western Governors University special fund 11 into which shall be deposited all revenues derived from the 12 13 State's participation in the Western Covernors University, 14 except University of Hawaii income from tuition and fees charged 15 for regular courses of instruction and tuition-related course 16 and fee charges to students. The fund shall be administered by 17 the board of regents of the University of Hawaii and shall be 18 used for the State's membership and participation in the Western 19 Covernors University."] 20 SECTION 9. Section 304A-2258, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

21 repealed.



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1	[" [\$304A-2258] University of Hawaii housing assistance	
2	revolving fund. There is established the University of Hawaii	
3	housing assistance revolving fund into which shall be deposited	
4	a portion of the total indirect overhead funds generated by the	
5	university for research and training purposes in the prior	
6	fiscal year as determined by the board of regents. The fund	
7	shall be used to:	
8	(1) Implement the university housing assistance master	
9	plan, in accordance with policies adopted by the board	
10	of regents; and	
11	(2) Account for all transactions of the university housing	
12	assistance program, including but not limited to	
13	revenues, expenditures, loans, and transfers."]	
14	SECTION 10. Section 304A-2265, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
15	repealed.	
16	[" [\$304A-2265] International exchange healthcare tourism	
17	revolving fund. (a) There is established the international	
18	exchange healthcare tourism revolving fund for the international	
19	exchange of healthcare tourism program into which shall be	
20	deposited all donations, gifts, contributions, legislative	
21	appropriations, and moneys generated by the program through	
22	education, training, and research contracts and grants. Moneys	
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1	deposited into this fund for the school of medicine and the
2	school of nursing and dental hygiene shall be divided into
3	separate accounts for each school, provided that moneys not
4	designated for use by a particular school shall be divided
5	equally. Moneys shall be expended from each account by the
6	school of medicine and the school of nursing and dental hygiene,
7	for student aid, training projects, teaching, supplies,
8	services, and activities related to the development and
9	promotion of the health-related tourism education program.
10	(b) All unexpended and unencumbered moneys appropriated by
11	the legislature remaining in the fund at the close of each
12	fiscal year that are deemed, by the director of finance, to be
13	in excess of the moneys necessary to carry out the purposes of
14	this section over the next following fiscal year shall lapse to
15	the credit of the state general fund."]
16	SECTION 11. Section 304A-2269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	repealed.
18	[" [§304A-2269] Community college and University of Hawaii
19	at Hilo bookstore revolving fund. There is established the
20	community college and University of Hawaii at Hilo bookstore
21	revolving fund for the community college and University of
22	Hawaii-at Hilo bookstores, from which shall be paid the cost of
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1 goods or services rendered or furnished to the bookstores and 2 which shall be replenished through charges made for goods and 3 services or through transfers from other accounts or funds."] 4 SECTION 12. Section 304A-2353, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 repealed. 6 ["[\$304A-2353] The Senator Hiram L. Fong-scholarship 7 program; endowment trust. (a) There is established the Senator 8 Hiram L. Fong scholarship program to be administered by the 9 university with proceeds from an endowment trust that shall 10 receive its initial funding by an appropriation out of the 11 general revenues of the State. The program shall provide 12 financial support to students enrolled at any campus of the 13 university. 14 (b) Awards shall be granted annually to one female student 15 and one male student who: 16 (1)Are graduates of a public high school in the State; 17 (2)Are upperclassmen at the university; 18 (3) Submit winning essays to the board of regents on the 19 senator's contributions to Hawaii; 20 (4) Have a demonstrated commitment to local community 21 issues, as shown by volunteer work and participation 22 in community organizations; and



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1	(5)	Have a demonstrated interest and knowledge of the
2		history of immigration to Hawaii.
3	(c)	The amount to be awarded to a student shall be
4	determine	d-by the board of regents with due regard to the total
5	amount of	funds available for the program. The award that a
6	student r	eceives under this program may be used to:
7	(1)	Pay for the costs of tuition and fees for a single
8		academic year;
9	-(2)	Pay for the costs of textbooks and other instructional
10		materials-for-a-single-academic-year;
11	(3)	Pay for the costs of room and board at a dormitory or
12		apartment maintained by the university for a single
13		academic year; or
14	-(4)-	Defray the difference between student need, as
15		determined by the Free Application for Federal Student
16		Aid, and the total cost of attendance for a single
17		academic year.
18	(d)	The board of regents shall adopt rules to implement
19	the Senat	or Hiram L. Fong scholarship program. The rules shall
20	be adopte	d pursuant to chapter 91 but shall be exempt from the
21	public-no	tice and public hearing requirements.



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1	(e) The scholarship program shall be funded with proceeds
2	from an endowment trust established with initial funding by an
3	appropriation out of the general revenues of the State and shall
4	be administered by the board of regents for the purposes of
5	supporting the Senator Hiram L. Fong scholarship program."]
6	SECTION 13. Section 304A-2354, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	repealed.
8	[" [§304A-2354] The Senator Oren E. Long scholarship
9	program; endowment trust. (a) There is established the Senator
10	Oren E. Long scholarship program to be administered by the
11	university with proceeds from an endowment trust that shall
12	receive its initial funding by an appropriation out of the
13	general revenues of the State. The program shall provide
14	financial support to students enrolled at any campus of the
15	university.
16	(b) Awards shall be granted annually to one female student
17	and one male student who:
18	(1) Are graduates of a public high school in the State;
19	(2) Are upperclassmen at the university; and
20	(3) Submit winning essays to the board of regents on the
21	senatorla contributiona to Hawaii



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1	(c) The amount to be awarded to a student shall be
2	determined by the board of regents with due regard to the total
3	amount of funds available for the program. The award that a
4	student receives under this program may be used to:
5	(1) Pay for the costs of tuition and fees for a single
6	academic year;
7	(2) Pay for the costs of textbooks and other instructional
8	materials for a single academic year;
9	(3) Pay for the costs of room and board at a dormitory or
10	apartment maintained by the university for a single
11	academic year; or
12	(4) Defray the difference between student need, as
13	determined by the Free Application for Federal Student
14	Aid, and the total cost of attendance for a single
15	academic year.
16	(d) The board of regents shall adopt rules to implement
17	the Senator Oren E. Long scholarship program. The rules shall
18	be adopted pursuant to chapter 91 but shall be exempt from the
19	public notice and public hearing requirements.
20	(e) The scholarship-program shall be funded with proceeds
21	from an endowment trust established with initial funding by an
22	appropriation out of the general revenues of the State and shall
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1 be administered by the board of regents for the purposes of 2 supporting the Senator Oren E. Long scholarship program."] 3 SECTION 14. All fund balances remaining unencumbered and 4 unexpended as of June 30, 2011 in the University of Hawaii 5 housing assistance revolving fund shall be transferred to the 6 credit of the Manoa faculty housing program under the University 7 of Hawaii auxiliary enterprises special fund established under 8 section 304A-2157, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 9 SECTION 15. The conversion of revolving funds to special 10 funds pursuant to sections 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of this Act 11 shall in no way be construed as an authorization to remove, 12 alter, or amend any moneys from any revolving fund other than 13 for the purposes of this Act and for the allowable uses under 14 relevant law. 15 SECTION 16. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 17 SECTION 17. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011. 18
