A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CERTAIN FUNDS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 304A-2252, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]\$304A-2252[+] Child care programs [revolving] special 4 fund. There is established a child care programs [revolving] 5 special fund for the operation of child care programs established under section 304A-116 and the construction and 6 7 renovation of child care centers established by the University 8 of Hawaii. Fees charged for child care at child care programs, 9 proceeds from donations to the university for child care 10 programs, and proceeds from loans or other instruments of 11 indebtedness for the construction or renovation of child care 12 centers shall be deposited into the [revolving] special fund. Expenditures from the [revolving] special fund shall be made for 13 14 the operation of child care programs and payment of principal 15 and interest on obligations incurred for the construction or 16 renovation of child care centers."

1 SECTION 2. Section 304A-2253, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended as follows: 3 1. By amending subsection (a) to read: There is established a University of Hawaii research 4 "(a) and training revolving fund into which shall be deposited one 5 hundred per cent of the total amount of indirect overhead 6 7 revenues generated by the university from research and training 8 programs. The board of regents is authorized to expend one 9 hundred per cent of the revenues deposited in the fund for: 10 Research and training purposes that may result in (1)additional research and training grants and contracts; 11 (2)Facilitating research and training at the university; 12 13 and 14 (3) Further deposit into the discoveries and inventions revolving fund [and the University of Hawaii housing 15 16 assistance revolving fund]." By amending subsection (c) to read: 17 2. Notwithstanding sections $304A-107[_{T}]$ and 18 "(C) [+]304A-2254[], and [304A-2258]] to the contrary, the board of 19 regents or its designee, may establish a separate account within 20 21 the research and training revolving fund for the purpose of providing advance funding to meet reimbursable costs incurred in 22 2011-1076 SB814 SD1 SMA.doc

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1 connection with federally financed research and training
2 projects. Any reimbursement received as a result of providing
3 advance funding shall be deposited into the research and
4 training revolving fund to be used for the purpose of meeting
5 reimbursable costs incurred in connection with federally
6 financed projects."

7 SECTION 3. Section 304A-2254, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended to read as follows:

9 "[4] §304A-2254[4] Discoveries and inventions revolving There is established a discoveries and inventions 10 fund. 11 [revolving] special fund into which shall be deposited a portion 12 of the total indirect overhead funds generated by the university 13 for research and training purposes in the prior fiscal year, as 14 determined by the board of regents. Appropriations by the legislature subject to the approval of the governor, proceeds 15 16 from the commercial exploitation of inventions and intellectual 17 property developed at the university, gifts, donations, fees collected, and grants from public agencies and private persons 18 19 may also be deposited into the special fund for the purposes of 20 supporting innovation and research commercialization and the 21 patenting, copyrighting, licensing, and marketing of discoveries, inventions, and technologies developed at the 22

university. The special fund shall be used to develop 1 2 technologies that have potential commercial value, support the 3 administration of technology transfer activities, and facilitate 4 economic development through education and research undertaken 5 at the university." 6 SECTION 4. Section 304A-2259, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended to read as follows: 8 "[+] §304A-2259[+] University of Hawaii alumni [revolving] 9. special fund. There is established the University of Hawaii 10 alumni [revolving] special fund into which shall be deposited 11 funds and proceeds received by the university from alumni 12 activities and donations from alumni. Funds deposited into this 13 [revolving] special fund may be expended by the university for 14 all costs associated with conducting alumni affairs, activities, 15 and programs for the university system, including but not limited to expenses for honoraria, hotel and room rentals, food 16 17 and refreshment, printing and mailing, banners and signs, plaques and awards, airfare and per diem, leis, rental of 18 19 audiovisual, musical, and stage equipment, and activity supplies 20 and materials, without regard to statutory competitive bidding 21 requirements."



1 SECTION 5. Section 304A-2261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "[+] §304A-2261[+] University of Hawaii at Manoa 4 intercollegiate athletics [revolving] special fund and 5 University of Hawaii at Hilo intercollegiate athletics 6 [revolving] special fund. Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, there are established the University of Hawaii at 7 Manoa intercollegiate athletics [revolving] special fund and the 8 9 University of Hawaii at Hilo intercollegiate athletics 10 [revolving] special fund for the intercollegiate athletic 11 programs of the University of Hawaii at Manoa and the University 12 of Hawaii at Hilo, which shall be used to receive, deposit, 13 disburse, and account for funds from the activities of the 14 intercollegiate athletic programs. The university may establish appropriate charges for activities related to its athletic 15 programs and the use of its athletic facilities, the proceeds 16 17 from which shall be deposited into these [revolving] special 18 funds.

19 The university shall maintain the financial integrity and 20 viability of these [revolving] special funds, including the 21 maintenance of an adequate reserve to cope with the various

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1 factors that impact the revenue structure of an intercollegiate 2 athletic program." 3 SECTION 6. Section 304A-2262, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 4 5 "[+]\$304A-2262[+] Animal research farm, Waialee, Oahu 6 [revolving] special fund. There is established the animal 7 research farm, Waialee, Oahu [revolving] special fund for the animal research farm, Waialee, Oahu, operated by the college of 8 9 tropical agriculture and human resources of the University of 10 Hawaii, into which shall be deposited the receipts from fees 11 realized from the sale of livestock, services, and supplies. 12 Funds deposited into this [revolving] special fund shall be 13 expended for animal research, and services and supplies related 14 thereto." 15 SECTION 7. Section 304A-2264, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

17 "[4]\$304A-2264[4] Conference center revolving fund;
18 University of Hawaii at Manoa. There is established the
19 conference center revolving fund for the conference center

20 program in [the college of continuing education and community
21 service of] the University of Hawaii at Manoa. All fees,
22 charges, and other moneys collected in conjunction with the



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1 conference center program shall be deposited in the revolving 2 fund. The [dean of the college of continuing education and 3 community service] chancellor of the University of Hawaii at 4 Manoa, or the chancellor's designee, is authorized to expend 5 funds from the revolving fund for all costs associated with conducting conferences, seminars, and courses by the conference 6 7 center program, including but not limited to expenses for fees 8 for service rendered, honoraria, hotel and room rentals, food and refreshment, printing and mailing, airfare and per diem, 9 10 leis, rental of audiovisual equipment, and [conference] other conference-related services, fees, supplies, and materials." 11 SECTION 8. Section 304A-2271, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 13 amended to read as follows:

"[+] §304A-2271[+] University of Hawaii-Hilo theatre 14 15 [revolving] special fund. There is established the University 16 of Hawaii-Hilo theatre [revolving] special fund, which shall 17 consist of admissions, advertising sales, corporate 18 sponsorships, marketing, merchandising, donations, fund-raising, 19 fees, charges, and other moneys collected in conjunction with 20 the University of Hawaii-Hilo theatre program. The [revolving] 21 special fund shall be administered by the office of 22 administrative affairs of the University of Hawaii at Hilo. 2011-1076 SB814 SD1 SMA.doc

1 Funds may be expended for all costs associated with the theatre 2 program, including artists' fees, production costs, personnel 3 costs, honoraria, per diem, hotel and room rentals, food and 4 refreshments, printing and mailing, advertising, airfare, leis, rental or purchase of equipment, and theater supplies and 5 6 materials." 7 SECTION 9. Section 304A-2158, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 repealed. 9 ["[§304A-2158] Western Governors University special fund. 10 There is established a Western Covernors University special fund 11 into which shall be deposited all revenues derived from the 12 State's participation in the Western Covernors University, 13 except University of Hawaii income from tuition and fees charged 14 for regular courses of instruction and tuition related course and fee charges to students. The fund shall be administered by 15 16 the board of regents of the University of Hawaii and shall be 17 used for the State's membership and participation in the Western 18 Covernors University."] 19 SECTION 10. Section 304A-2258, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 repealed. ["[§304A-2258] University of Hawaii housing assistance 21

22 revolving fund. There is established the University of Hawaii

12	SECTION 11. Section 304A-2265, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	repealed.
14	[" [§304A-2265] International exchange healthcare tourism
15	revolving fund. (a) There is established the international
16	exchange healthcare tourism revolving fund for the international
17	exchange of healthcare tourism program into which shall be
18	deposited all donations, gifts, contributions, legislative
19	appropriations, and moneys generated by the program through
20	education, training, and research contracts and grants. Moneys
21	deposited into this fund for the school of medicine and the
22	school of nursing and dental hygiene shall be divided into
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1	separate accounts for each school, provided that moneys not
2	designated for use by a particular school shall be divided
3	equally. Moneys shall be expended from each account by the
4	school of medicine and the school of nursing and dental hygiene,
5	for student aid, training projects, teaching, supplies,
6	services, and activities related to the development and
7	promotion of the health related tourism education program.
8	(b) All unexpended and unencumbered moneys appropriated by
9	the legislature remaining in the fund at the close of each
10	fiscal year that are deemed, by the director of finance, to be
11	in excess of the moneys necessary to carry out the purposes of
12	this section over the next following fiscal year shall lapse to
13	the credit of the state general fund."]
14	SECTION 12. Section 304A-2269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	repealed.
16	[" [§304A-2269] Community college and University of Hawaii
17	at Hilo bookstore revolving fund. There is established the
18	community college and University of Hawaii at Hilo bookstore
19	revolving fund for the community college and University of
20	Hawaii at Hilo bookstores, from which shall be paid the cost of
21	goods or services rendered or furnished to the bookstores and



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1	which shall be replenished through charges made for goods and
2	services or through transfers from other accounts or funds."]
3	SECTION 13. Section 304A-2353, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	repealed.
5	[" [§304A-2353] The Senator Hiram L. Fong scholarship
6	program; endowment trust. (a) There-is-established the Senator
7	Hiram L. Fong scholarship program to be administered by the
8	university with proceeds from an endowment trust that shall
9	receive its initial funding by an appropriation out of the
10	general revenues of the State. The program shall provide
11	financial support to students enrolled at any campus of the
12	university.
13	(b) Awards shall be granted annually to one female student
14	and one male student who:
15	(1) Are graduates of a public high school in the State;
16	(2) Are upperclassmen at the university;
17	(3) Submit winning essays to the board of regents on the
18	senator's contributions to Hawaii;
19	(4) Have a demonstrated commitment to local community
20	issues, as shown by volunteer work and participation
21	in community organizations; and

3	(c)	The amount to be awarded to a student shall be

7	(1)	Pay for the costs of tuition and fees for a single
8		academic year;
9	(2)	Pay for the costs of textbooks and other instructional
10		materials for a single academic year;
11	(3)	Pay for the costs of room and board at a dormitory or
12		apartment maintained by the university for a single
13		academic year; or
14	-(4)-	Defray the difference between student need, as
15		determined by the Free Application for Federal Student
16		Aid, and the total cost of attendance for a single
17		academic year.
18	.(d)	The board of regents shall adopt rules to implement
19	the Senat	or Hiram L. Fong scholarship program. The rules shall
20	be adopte	d pursuant to chapter 91 but shall be exempt from the
21	public no	tice and public hearing requirements.

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1	(c) The scholarship program shall be funded with proceeds
2	from an endowment trust established with initial funding by an
3	appropriation out of the general revenues of the State and shall
4	be administered by the board of regents for the purposes of
5	supporting the Senator Hiram L. Fong scholarship program."]
6	SECTION 14. Section 304A-2354, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	repealed.
8	[" [§304A-2354] The Senator Oren E. Long scholarship
9	program; endowment trust. (a) There is established the Senator
10	Oren E. Long scholarship program to be administered by the
11	university with proceeds from an endowment trust that shall
12	receive its initial funding by an appropriation out of the
13	general revenues of the State. The program shall provide
14	financial support to students enrolled at any campus of the
15	university.
16	(b) Awards shall be granted annually to one female, student
17	and one male student who:
18	(1) Are graduates of a public high school in the State;
19	(2) Are upperclassmen at the university; and
20	(3) Submit winning essays to the board of regents on the
21	senator's contributions to Hawaii.

18	be adopted pursuant to chapter 91 but shall be exempt from the
19	public notice and public hearing requirements.
20	(e) The scholarship program shall be funded with proceeds
21	from an endowment trust established with initial funding by an
22	appropriation out of the general revenues of the State and shall
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1 be administered by the board of regents for the purposes of 2 supporting the Senator Oren E. Long scholarship program."] 3 SECTION 15. All fund balances remaining unencumbered and 4 unexpended as of June 30, 2011, in the University of Hawaii 5 conference center revolving fund shall be transferred to the 6 University of Hawaii auxiliary enterprise special fund 7 established under section 304A-2157, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 8 SECTION 16. All fund balances remaining unencumbered and 9 unexpended as of June 30, 2011 in the University of Hawaii 10 housing assistance revolving fund shall be transferred to the credit of the Manoa faculty housing program under the University 11 12 of Hawaii auxiliary enterprises special fund established under section 304A-2157, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 13 14 SECTION 17. The conversion of revolving funds to special funds pursuant to sections 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of this Act 15 16 shall in no way be construed as an authorization to remove, 17 alter, or amend any moneys from any revolving fund other than 18 for the purposes of this Act and for the allowable uses under 19 relevant law. 20 SECTION 18. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



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This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011. SECTION 19.
