A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE KAHO'OLAWE ISLAND RESERVE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The Kaho'olawe island reserve commission is
funded predominantly by a dwindling trust fund created in 1994
during the federal unexploded ordnance cleanup of Kaho'olawe.
This federal appropriation, totaling \$44,000,000 over a period
of several years, even though considerable, was not substantial
enough to establish a sustainable endowment for the long-term
restoration of Kaho'olawe.

8 As stated in the federally-mandated Kaho'olawe island 9 conveyance commission final report to Congress in 1993, "in the 10 short term, federal funds will provide the bulk of the program 11 support for specific soil conservation projects and related 12 In the longer term, however, state revenues will be activities. 13 needed to continue and enhance those activities initiated with 14 federal funds". For the past sixteen years, the initial federal 15 funding has allowed the Kaho'olawe island reserve commission to 16 establish many of its innovative programs that emphasize 17 ancestral and traditional knowledge, utilize a cultural approach



1	of respect and connectivity to the environment, and integrate	
2	ancient and modern resource management techniques.	
3	The purpose of this Act is to direct the deposit of a	
4	percentage of the conveyance tax into the Kahoʻolawe	
5	rehabilitation trust fund to provide a continuous source of	
6	state funding for the rehabilitation and maintenance of the	
7	Kahoʻolawe island reserve.	
8	SECTION 2. Section 247-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
9	amended to read as follows:	
10	"§24	7-7 Disposition of taxes. All taxes collected under
11	this chapter shall be paid into the state treasury to the credit	
12	of the general fund of the State, to be used and expended for	
13	the purposes for which the general fund was created and exists	
14	by law; provided that of the taxes collected each fiscal year:	
15	(1)	Ten per cent shall be paid into the land conservation
16		fund established pursuant to section 173A-5;
17	(2)	Twenty-five per cent from July 1, 2009, until June 30,
18		2012, and thirty per cent in each fiscal year
19		thereafter shall be paid into the rental housing trust
20		fund established by section 201H-202; [and]
21	(3)	Twenty per cent from July 1, 2009, until June 30,
22		2012, and twenty-five per cent in each fiscal year



1 thereafter shall be paid into the natural area reserve 2 fund established by section 195-9; provided that the 3 funds paid into the natural area reserve fund shall be annually disbursed by the department of land and 4 natural resources in the following priority: 5 6 (A) To natural area partnership and forest 7 stewardship programs after joint consultation 8 with the forest stewardship committee and the 9 natural area reserves system commission; 10 [Projects] To projects undertaken in accordance (B) 11 with watershed management plans pursuant to 12 section 171-58 or watershed management plans 13 negotiated with private landowners, and 14 management of the Hawaii natural area reserves 15 system pursuant to section 195-3; and 16 (C) [The] To the youth conservation corps established 17 under chapter 193[-]; and 18 (4) Ten per cent shall be paid into the Kaho'olawe 19 rehabilitation trust fund established by section 20 6K-9.5." 21 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 22 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
