### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Reinventing 2 Education Act of 2004 (Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004) 3 established a weighted student formula to allocate moneys to schools according to the different costs of educating students 4 5 with different needs. Despite the intended equitable 6 distribution of funds, the legislature finds that the weighted student formula has placed small, remote schools at a 7 8 disadvantage. In the case of Hana high school and elementary, 9 the budgetary shortfall resulted in the loss of several well-10 qualified teachers and threatened the school's ability to offer 11 minimum course requirements for students to earn high school 12 diplomas in 2010. If Hana high school is unable to offer its 13 students the requisite courses for graduation, those students 14 will have to endure a nearly forty-mile, two-hour drive away to 15 the next closest public high school, King Kekaulike high school.

16 The legislature finds that despite the current economic 17 situation, remote schools should be funded to retain the minimal 18 personnel and resources necessary to graduate students. As of 2011-0739 SB SMA.doc

1	2005, six schools were excepted from weighted student formula
2	allocations, receiving instead categorical allotments that
3	guarantee the minimum number of positions and amount of
4	resources to ensure that school operations can continue.
5	The purpose of this Act is to require that funding
6	allocations for remote schools be determined by categorical
7	allotments rather than the weighted student formula.
8	SECTION 2. Section 302A-1303.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
9	is amended to read as follows:
10	"§302A-1303.6 Weighted student formula. (a) Based upon
11	recommendations from the committee on weights, the board of
12	education, not less than annually, shall adopt a weighted
13	student formula for the allocation of moneys to public schools
14	that takes into account the educational needs of each student.
15	The department, upon the receipt of appropriated moneys, shall
16	use the weighted student formula to allocate funds to public
17	schools $[-]$ ; provided that a remote school, as defined in
18	subsection (b), and other schools designated by the committee on
19	weights shall not be allocated operating funds using the
20	weighted student formula and shall instead be allocated
21	operating funds by categorical allotments that guarantee the
22	funding of a minimum number of instructional positions to ensure
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1	that at least minimum course requirements are maintained.
2	Principals shall expend moneys provided to the principals'
3	schools. This section shall only apply to charter schools for
4	fiscal years in which the charter schools elect [ <del>pursuant to</del>
5	section 302B 13] to receive allocations according to the
6	weighted student formula [-] pursuant to section $302B-13$ .
7	(b) For purposes of this section, "remote school" means
8	any public school, as defined in section 302A-101, that is a
9	high school:
10	(1) Located at least a one-hour drive away from the next
11	nearest public high school; or
12	(2) Located on the island of Lanai, Molokai, or Niihau;
13	provided that if a high school is combined with an elementary,
14	middle, intermediate, or other lower level of schooling, that
15	entire school shall be deemed a high school for the purposes of
16	this subsection."
17	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
18	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
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SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.

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#### Report Title:

Weighted Student Formula; Exception; Remote Schools

#### Description:

Requires remote schools to be allocated funds using categorical allotments, rather than through the weighted student formula. Defines a remote school as any public school that is a high school located at least a one-hour drive away from the next nearest high school or a high school located on the island of Lanai, Molokai, or Niihau.

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
