#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BULLYING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
 and to read as follows:

4 "<u>§302A-</u> Bullying policy. (a) The board shall adopt a
5 policy that prohibits bullying of a student by another student
6 and shall require the prohibition to be included in the student
7 code of conduct. The policy shall:

8	(1)	Require that, upon a finding by the complex area
<b>9</b>		superintendent that a student in grades six through
10		twelve has committed the offense of bullying for the
11		third time in a school year, the student shall be
12		assigned to another school; provided that this
13		paragraph shall not be construed to require the board
14		to provide transportation to a student transferred to
15		another school as a result of a bullying incident; and
16	(2)	Include a method to notify the parent, guardian, or
17	r	other person who has control or charge of a student
18		upon a finding by a school administrator that the
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1		student has committed an offense of bullying or is a
2		victim of bullying.
3	The board	shall ensure that students and parents of students are
4	notified	of the prohibition against bullying, and the penalties
5	for viola	ting the prohibitions, by posting the information at
6	<u>each scho</u>	ol and by including the information in student and
7	parent ha	ndbooks.
8	(b)	The department shall develop a model policy regarding
9	bullying,	which may be revised from time to time, and shall post
10	the polic	y on its website. The model policy shall include:
11	(1)	A statement prohibiting bullying;
12	(2)	A requirement that any teacher or other school
13		employee who has reliable information that would lead
14		a reasonable person to suspect that someone is a
15		target of bullying shall immediately report it to the
16		school principal;
17	(3)	A requirement that each school have a procedure for
18		the school administration to promptly investigate in a
19		timely manner and determine whether bullying has
20		occurred;
21	(4)	An age-appropriate range of consequences for bullying
22		that shall include, at minimum and without limitation,
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1	•	disciplinary action or counseling as appropriate under
2		the circumstances;
3	(5)	A procedure for a teacher or other school employee,
4		student, parent, guardian, or other person who has
5		control or charge of a student, either anonymously or
6		in the person's name, at the person's option, to
7		report or otherwise provide information on bullying
8		activity; and
9	(6)	A statement prohibiting retaliation following a report
10		of bullying.
11	(C)	The department shall develop and post on its website a
12	list of e	ntities and their contact information that produce
13	anti-bull	ying training programs and materials deemed appropriate
14	by the dep	partment for use in schools.
15	<u>(d)</u>	Any person who reports an incident of bullying in good
16	faith sha	ll be immune from civil liability for any damages
17	caused by	the reporting.
18	<u>(e)</u>	As used in this section, "bullying" means an act that
19	occurs on	school property, on school vehicles, at designated
20	school bus	s stops, or at school related functions or activities,
21	or by use	of data or software that is accessed through a



1	computer,	computer system, computer network, or other electronic
2	technolog	y of a local school system, that is:
3	(1)	Any willful attempt or threat to inflict injury on
4		another person, when accompanied by an apparent
5		present ability to do so;
6	(2)	Any intentional display of force that would give the
7		victim reason to fear or expect immediate bodily harm;
8		or
9	(3)	Any intentional written, verbal, or physical act that
10		a reasonable person would perceive as being intended
11		to threaten, harass, or intimidate, that:
12		(A) Causes another person substantial bodily harm;
13		(B) Has the effect of substantially interfering with
14		a student's education;
15	•	(C) Is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it
16		creates an intimidating or threatening
17		educational environment; or
18		(D) Has the effect of substantially disrupting the
19		orderly operation of the school.
20	<u>(f)</u>	The superintendent of education shall adopt rules in
21	accordance	e with chapter 91 to implement this section."
22	SECT	ION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
