A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STANDARDS OF CONDUCT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Current law provides for an initial mandatory
ethics training course for legislators, elected members of the
board of education, trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs,
the governor, the lieutenant governor, and executive department
heads and deputies. However, there is no provision for
mandatory continuing ethics training.

7 The legislature finds that continuous ethics training on an 8 annual basis is necessary to ensure the integrity of conduct of 9 elected officials and certain appointed officers. According to 10 the National Conference of State Legislatures, the following 11 states offer online interactive ethics training or post ethics 12 manuals or related materials online: California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Massachusetts, New 13 14 Jersey, New York, and Texas.

15 The purpose of this Act is to require mandatory continuing 16 ethics education for elected officials and certain appointed 17 officers of the State.



1	SECTION 2. Chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to part V to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§84-</u> <u>Mandatory continuing ethics training course.</u> (a)
5	All state officers and employees enumerated in section 84-41 who
6	have completed an initial mandatory ethics training course under
7	section 84-42 shall complete a continuing ethics training course
8	at least once every two years after the individual's initial
9	election or initial appointment, as applicable, if the
10	individual remains with the State as an officer or employee.
11	(b) The continuing ethics training course shall be
12	administered by the state ethics commission and shall be offered
13	online and on demand, beginning June 1, 2012.
14	(c) The continuing ethics training course shall include an
15	updated review of the information covered in the initial ethics
16	training course under section 84-43, and information concerning:
17	(1) Advisory opinions issued within the two-year period
18	immediately preceding the course; and
19	(2) Any other information that addresses current ethics
20	issues as determined by the executive director of the
21	state ethics commission.



1	The continuing ethics training course shall allow for the
2	inclusion of typed-in email questions from each attendee,
3	addressed to the executive director of the state ethics
4	commission; provided that the questions shall not be deemed to
5	constitute a request for an advisory opinion. The executive
6	director shall reply appropriately.
7	(d) The executive director of the state ethics commission
8	shall make a record of each person who completes the mandatory
9	continuing ethics training course, which record shall constitute
10	a public record.
11	(e) Completion of the mandatory continuing ethics training
12	course under this section:
13	(1) Shall not be deemed to diminish personal
14	responsibility for adherence to this chapter; and
15	(2) Shall not be used or admitted into evidence in any
16	proceeding against the person completing any
17	continuing ethics training course.
18	(f) As used in this section:
19	"Email" means electronic mail that is a store-and-forward
20	method of writing, sending, receiving, and sending messages over
21	a computer network.



1	"On demand" means the capability of being instantly
2	accessed over the Internet.
3	"Online" means the delivery of a learning, training, or
4	education program over the Internet by the use of a computer."
5	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
