A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that homelessness is a societal problem that has plaqued Hawaii and the nation for many 2 3 years. Although great strides have been made in addressing the 4 issue of homelessness, Hawaii has experienced an increase in the 5 number of homeless persons. Homelessness remains a complex 6 issue involving coordination, planning, implementation, and 7 funding among state and county agencies, non-profit entities, 8 and the federal government. On June 22, 2010, the cabinet secretaries from the federal 10 Departments of Housing and Urban Development, Labor, Health and 11 Human Services, and Veterans Affairs joined the United States 12 Interagency Council on Homelessness to unveil and submit to the 13 President and Congress the nation's first comprehensive 14 strategic plan to prevent and end homelessness. The United 15 States Interagency Council on Homelessness comprises nineteen 16 federal agencies to coordinate the nation's housing, health,

- 1 government and the private sector to maximize the effectiveness
- 2 of the federal government's response in addressing homelessness.
- 3 Described by the federal government as the most far-
- 4 reaching and ambitious program in history to prevent and end
- 5 homelessness, the strategic plan will strengthen existing
- 6 programs and forge new partnerships. Working together with
- 7 Congress, state and local officials, faith-based and community
- 8 organizations, and business and philanthropic leaders across the
- 9 country, the plan will harness public and private resources to
- 10 build on proven local level innovations.
- 11 The legislature finds that Hawaii must have in place a
- 12 mechanism similar to the United States Interagency Council on
- 13 Homelessness to formulate and coordinate a unified plan to
- 14 address homelessness in all counties and facilitate the
- 15 acquisition of federal funding for homeless programs. The
- 16 United States Interagency Council on Homelessness recommends
- 17 that the states establish such a state agency whether by
- 18 legislative action or executive order, or both.
- The purpose of this Act is to establish the Hawaii
- 20 interagency council on homelessness.
- 21 SECTION 2. There is established the Hawaii interagency
- 22 council on homelessness, which shall be an advisory body exempt



- 1 from section 26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The Hawaii
- 2 interagency council on homelessness shall be under the
- 3 department of human services for administrative purposes. The
- 4 director of human services shall serve as the ad hoc coordinator
- 5 of the Hawaii interagency council on homelessness. The members
- 6 of the Hawaii interagency council on homelessness shall serve
- 7 without compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses,
- 8 including travel expenses, necessary for the performance of
- 9 their duties.
- 10 The Hawaii interagency council on homelessness shall be
- 11 responsible for organizing its member entities to formulate and
- 12 coordinate a unified plan to address homelessness in all
- 13 counties and facilitate the acquisition of federal funding for
- 14 homeless programs.
- 15 SECTION 3. The Hawaii interagency council on homelessness
- 16 shall be composed of at least one representative from each of
- 17 the following offices:
- 18 (1) The office of the governor, to be designated by the
- 19 governor;
- 20 (2) The senate, to be designated by the president of the
- 21 senate;

4		of the department of human services, to be designated

18		health, to be designated by the director of health;
19	(10)	The alcohol and drug abuse division of the department

2		of public safety, to be designated by the director of

4	(12)	The workforce development division of the department
5		of labor and industrial relations, to be designated by
6		the director of labor and industrial relations;
7	(13)	The department of education employee or designee who
8		is responsible for the administration of the McKinney-
9		Vento Homeless Assistance Act, to be designated by the
10		superintendent of education;
11	(14)	The Hawaii head start program of the department of
12		human services, to be designated by the director of
13		human services;
14	(15)	The homeless programs of the United States Department
15		of Veterans Affairs, to be designated by the head of
16		the Hawaii office of the United States Department of
17		Veterans Affairs;
18	(16)	The center on the family at the University of Hawaii;
19	(17)	The Office of Community Planning and Development of
20		the United States Department of Housing and Urban
21		Development, to be designated by the director of the
22		Hawaii office of the Office of Community Planning and

1		Development of the United States Department of Housing
2		and Urban Development;
3	(18)	The mayor of each county or the mayor's designee, who
4		shall be responsible for the administration of
5		homeless and housing programs for that county;
6	(19)	The director or head of the continuum of care
7		collaboration of each county, as follows:
8		(A) Maui homeless alliance;
9		(B) Community action partners (Hawaii county);
10		(C) Partners in care (city and county of Honolulu);
11		and
12		(D) Kauai community alliance;
13	(20)	The Hawaii Association of Realtors, to be designated
14		by the president of the Hawaii Association of
15		Realtors;
16	(21)	A community health center that provides services to
17		the homeless;
18	(22)	The Roman Catholic Diocese of Honolulu, to be
19		designated by the bishop of Honolulu; and
20	(23)	The executive director of the Office for Social
21		Ministry, Big Island Branch.

13		of care collaboration entities;
14	(7)	Assemble accurate fiscal and demographic information
15		and research and data to support policy development
16		and to track outcomes;
17	(8)	Establish priorities based upon the ten-year plan to
18		end homelessness;
19	(9)	Recommend interagency strategies including funding,
20		homelessness prevention, and discharge planning;
21	(10)	Review all state activities and programs to assist
22		homeless persons;

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1	(11)	Support and replicate collaborative state homelessness
2		initiatives of other states that demonstrate
3		measurable outcomes;
4	(12)	Promote systems integration of health services and
5		housing to reduce duplication among homeless
6		assistance programs;
7	(13)	Identify funding opportunities, including mainstream
8		resources for homeless persons;
9	(14)	Involve non-traditional stakeholders, including
10		representatives from corporations; business,
11		philanthropic, and faith-based organizations; and
12		other community institutions;
13	(15)	Recommend to the legislature statutory changes and
14		recommend to the executive departments regulatory
15		changes to enhance the successful implementation of
16		this Act;
17	(16)	Communicate problems and concerns relating to homeless
18		persons to the appropriate state or county agencies;
19	(17)	Report annually to the governor, the legislature, each
20		county mayor, and each county council on the progress
2,1		of creating and implementing a ten-year plan to end
22		homelessness;

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1	(18)	Conduct a public education program on homelessness;
2	(19)	Disseminate information, including data and best
3		practices, to state and county officials and to the
4		public regarding issues related to homelessness; and
5	(20)	Host or cause to be conducted an annual homelessness
6		conference.
7	SECT	ION 5. If any provision of this Act is found to be in
8	conflict	with a federal requirement, the federal requirement
9	shall pre	vail and the provision shall be deemed to be amended to
10	conform t	o the federal requirement.
11	SECT	ION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
