A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 356D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 Guests; visitor passes. (a) Any visitor, upon "§356D-5 entering the premises of a public housing project, shall acquire 6 a visitor pass from the manager of the public housing project or 7 the manager's designee; provided that a manager shall issue a 8 visitor pass only to a visitor invited onto the premises by an 9 adult tenant of the public housing project. 10 The authority shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 (b) 11 for the purposes of this section." 12 SECTION 2. Section 708-813, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows: 14 (1)A person commits the offense of criminal trespass in the first degree if: 15 16 (a) That person knowingly enters or remains unlawfully: 17 (i) In a dwelling; or

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1		(ii) In or upon the premises of a hotel or apartment
2		building;
3	(b)	That person:
4		(i) Knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in or upon
5		premises that are fenced or enclosed in a manner
6		designed to exclude intruders; and
7		(ii) Is in possession of a firearm, as defined in
8		section 134-1, at the time of the intrusion; or
9	(c)	That person enters or remains unlawfully in or upon
10		the premises of any public school as defined in
11		section 302A-101, or any private school, after
12		reasonable warning or request to leave by school
13		authorities or a police officer; provided [however,
14		such] that a warning or request to leave shall be
15		unnecessary between 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.; or
16	<u>(d)</u>	That person enters or remains unlawfully in or upon
17	w	the premises of any public housing project, as defined
18		in section 356D-1 or 356D-91, after reasonable warning
19		or request to leave by housing management or
20		authorities or a police officer; provided that
21		remaining on the premises of any public housing
22		project without a visitor's pass, pursuant to section

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1	356D- , shall be prima facie evidence of a violation
2	of this section."
3	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
4	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
5	begun before its effective date.
6	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
7	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
8	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.

Public Housing; Visitor Pass; Trespassing

Description:

Requires all visitors to public housing projects to receive a visitor pass from authorities of the public housing project. Establishes the non-possession of a visitor pass as prima facie evidence of criminal trespass in the first degree.

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
