BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

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1	admitting	the minor poses a danger, the provider shall report

3	<u>(b)</u>	A minor may consent to emergency shelter and related
4	services	if a provider has offered the shelter and services
5	without c	harge, the minor understands the benefits,
6	responsib	ilities, risks, and limits of the shelter and services,
7	and the m	inor agrees to adhere to the provider's rules and
8	cooperate	and participate in those services recommended by the
9	provider,	provided that:
10	(1)	The provider has not, despite reasonable efforts, been
11		able to contact the minor's parent, legal guardian, or

8	<u>(C)</u>	Any consent given by a minor under this section shall,
9	for the du	ration of the period of shelter and with respect to
10	all servic	ces, be valid and binding as if the minor had reached
11	the age of	f majority. Any other provisions of law
12	notwithsta	anding, the minor shall be deemed to have and shall
13	have the s	same legal capacity to act, and shall have the same
14	legal obli	igations with regard to the giving of informed consent,

14	(4)	Assistance in obtaining clothing;
15	(5)	Access to medical and dental care, and mental health
16		counseling;
		Education and employment services;

18	<u>(7)</u>	Recreational activities;
19	(8)	Case management, advocacy, and referral services;
20	<u>(9)</u>	Independent living skills training; and
21	(10)	Aftercare services, as those services are defined in

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1	"Minor" means a person less than eighteen years of age.
2	"Provider" means any child-placing organization, or child-
3	caring institution authorized by the department under section
4	346-17 to receive or place minor children for care and
5	maintenance and to provide related services, health care, or
6	supplies to these minors."
