A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Act 100, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, is 2 amended by amending section 2 to read as follows: "SECTION 2. (a) There is established in the state 3 4 treasury the safe routes to school fund, into which shall be 5 deposited: 6 Federal Safe Routes to School program funds; and (1)7 (2) Fines collected for speeding in a school zone, 8 pursuant to section 291C-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 9 Moneys in the fund shall be distributed by the director of 10 transportation to the respective counties to expend. 11 director of transportation shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 12 91 to implement this Act. The rules shall establish a formula 13 by which the moneys in the fund shall be distributed to each 14 county and provide how the county shall expend the moneys for 15 traffic calming measures in public school zones. 16 $[\frac{1}{100}]$ (b) The director of transportation, through the Safe 17 Routes to School coordinator, and in consultation with the 18 department of education, department of health, and Hawaii

5	SECTION 2. Section 291C-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
7	"(c) Any person who violates this section shall be fined
8	[\$250] $$350$, of which $$100$ is to be deposited in the safe routes
9	to school fund, and may be charged with a surcharge of up to
10	\$100 to be deposited into the trauma system special fund."
11	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
