A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many high school students are sleep deprived, resulting in poorer academic and 2 athletic performance. The legislature further finds that while 3 4 there are social reasons for teenagers staying awake later, such as chatting online or on the phone and watching television, 5 there are also practical and biological reasons for staying up 6 late. With adolescence come greater academic responsibilities 7 8 and increased involvement in extracurricular activities, as well as more time spent earning money. Some research has found that 9 teenagers who are thirteen to nineteen years old also have a 10 biological tendency toward later waking hours, and most 11 teenagers are prevented from sleeping in during school days. 12 The aforementioned factors result in sleep deprivation in many 13 teenagers, leading to poorer grades, poorer driving, and greater 14 emotional problems such as sadness and depression. The 15 legislature finds that Hawaii's public high school students 16 17 would benefit from a later start time in school, enabling

18 students to obtain adequate sleep.

8	shall begin classes no earlier than 9:00 a.m.; provided that
9	regardless of class start time, each school shall be subject to
10	the minimum instructional time requirements under section
11	<u>302A-251.</u> "
12	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
