A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BUDGET OF THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds
 for the biennial budget of the office of Hawaiian affairs. This
 Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Office of Hawaiian
 Affairs Appropriations Act of 2011".

5 SECTION 2. Unless otherwise clear from the context, as
6 used in this Act:

7 "Program ID" means the unique identifier of the specific
8 program, and consists of the abbreviation for the office of
9 Hawaiian affairs followed by a designated number for the
10 program.

II "Means of financing", or "MOF", means the source from which I2 funds are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, to be I3 expended for the programs and projects specified in this Act. I4 Letter symbols following appropriations have the following I5 meanings:

16 A: General Funds

17 T: Trust Funds

4	SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may					
5	be necessary to accomplish the purposes and programs designated					
6	herein, are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, from					
7	the sources of funding specified to the office of Hawaiian

8	affairs for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and					
9	ending June 30, 2013. The total general fund expenditures and					
10	the number of permanent positions established in each fiscal					
11	year of the biennium shall not exceed the sums and the position

13 SECTION 4. Provided that the general fund appropriations 14 in section 3 of this Act shall be expended by the office of 15 Hawaiian affairs.

SECTION 5. Provided that of the funds appropriated for 16 17 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$ in general 18 funds and \$ in trust funds for fiscal year 2011-2012 and 19 the sum of \$ in general funds and \$ in trust funds 20 for fiscal year 2012-2013 shall provide for social services to 21 office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries to include information 22 and referral services, case management and counseling, 23 establishment of individual development accounts, financial 24 literacy, and financial assistance. Referral services include 25 those relating to education assistance, employment and income 26 security, individual and family care, health needs, housing, legal services, genealogy research, business assistance, and 27

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general information; provided that notwithstanding section 10 17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any moneys expended for the
 purposes of this section shall be in accordance with chapter
 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as appropriate.

5 SECTION 6. Provided that of the funds appropriated for 6 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$ in general 7 funds and \$ in trust funds for fiscal year 2011-2012 and 8 the sum of \$ in general funds and \$ in trust funds 9 for fiscal year 2012-2013 shall provide for educational 10 enrichment programs for native Hawaiian children in grades K 11 through 12 throughout the State. Program activities shall be 12 designed to optimize learning for Hawaiian students and are 13 intended to develop a stronger interest in learning, connect 14 learning and education to one's Hawaiian identity, and explore possible educational, career, and academic goals that the 15 16 students may not have considered; provided that notwithstanding 17 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended 18 for the purposes of this section shall be in accordance with 19 chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as appropriate. 20 SECTION 7. Provided that of the funds appropriated for 21 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$ in general 22 funds and \$ in trust funds for fiscal year 2011-2012 and

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1 the sum of \$ in general funds and \$ in trust funds 2 for fiscal year 2012-2013 shall provide legal services and legal 3 representation to office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries for 4 the assertion and defense of quiet title actions; assistance with ahupua'a and kuleana tenant rights, including rights of 5 6 access and rights to water; land title assistance, including 7 review of title and genealogy; preservation of traditional and 8 customary practices; protection of culturally significant 9 places; and preservation of native Hawaiian land trust 10 entitlements; provided that notwithstanding section 10-17(e), 11 Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended for the purposes of 12 this section shall be in accordance with chapter 103D or 103F, 13 Hawaii Revised Statutes, as appropriate.

14 SECTION 8. Provided that whenever the need arises, the board of trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs or their 15 16 designee is authorized to transfer sufficient funds and 17 positions between programs for operating purposes; provided that 18 these transfers shall not be inconsistent with legislative 19 intent; provided further that a report of these fund transfers 20 shall be made to the legislature no later than thirty days prior 21 to the convening of the 2012 and 2013 regular sessions.



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1	SECTION 9. If any portion of this Act or its application
2	to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid for any
3	reason, the remainder of the Act and any provision thereof shall
4	not be affected. If any portion of a specific appropriation is
5	held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
6	be independent of the invalid portion and shall be expended to
7	fulfill the objective and intent of the appropriation to the
8	extent possible.
9	SECTION 10. In the event manifest clerical, typographical,
10	or other mechanical errors are found in this Act, the board of
11	trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs is hereby authorized
12	to correct such errors. All changes made pursuant to this
13	section shall be reported to the legislature at its next
14	session.
