### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 11-334, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"[+]§11-334[+] Time for candidate committee to file
4	preliminary, final, and supplemental reports. (a) The
5	candidate and treasurer of the candidate committee of each
6	candidate whose name will appear on the ballot in the
7	immediately succeeding election shall file preliminary, final,
8	and supplemental reports.
9	(1) The filing dates for preliminary reports are:
10	(A) July $[\frac{31}{5}]$ of the election year;
11	(B) Ten calendar days prior to a primary, each
12	special, or each nonpartisan election; [and]

13 (C) September 30 of the election year; and

14 [<del>(C)</del>] <u>(D)</u> Ten calendar days prior to a general 15 election; provided that this preliminary report 16 does not need to be filed by a candidate who is 17 unsuccessful in a primary, special, or 18 nonpartisan election or a candidate who is



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1		elected to office in the primary, initial
2		special, or initial nonpartisan election.
3	· · ·	Each preliminary report shall be current through
4		June 30 for the report filed on July $[31]$ 5 and
5		current through the fifth calendar day before the
6		filing deadline of other preliminary reports.
7	(2)	The filing date for the final primary report is twenty
8		calendar days after a primary, initial special, or
9		initial nonpartisan election. The report shall be
10		current through the day of the applicable election.
11	(3)	The filing date for the final election period report
12		is thirty calendar days after a general, subsequent,
13		subsequent special, or subsequent nonpartisan
14		election. The report shall be current through the day
15		of the applicable election. The final election period
16		report shall be filed by a candidate who is
17		unsuccessful in a primary, initial special, or initial
18		nonpartisan election or a candidate who is elected to
19		office in the primary, initial special, or initial
20		nonpartisan election.
21	(4)	The filing dates for supplemental reports are:
22		(A) January 31 after an election year; and



1	(B) July 31 after an election year.
2	The report shall be current through December 31 for
3	the report filed on January 31 and current through
4	June 30 for the report filed on July 31.
5	(b) A candidate and treasurer of the candidate committee
6	of each candidate with a deficit or surplus whose name will not
7	appear on the ballot in the immediately succeeding election
8	shall file a supplemental report every six months on January 31
9	and July 31 until:
10	(1) The candidate's name appears on the ballot and then is
11	subject to the reporting requirements in subsection
12	(a); or
13	(2) The committee's registration is terminated as provided
14	in section 11-326.
15	The report shall be current through December 31 for the
16	report filed on January 31 and current through June 30 for the
17	report filed on July 31.
18	(c) Prior to an election year, a candidate and treasurer
19	of the candidate committee of a candidate who registers pursuant
20	to section 11-321 shall file a supplemental report as required
21	by subsection (b) until the election year. During the election
22	year, reports required by subsection (a) shall be filed.

. 1	[ <del>(c)</del> ] <u>(d)</u> A candidate and treasurer of the candidate
2	committee of each candidate shall continue to file all required
3	reports until the committee's registration is terminated as
4	provided in section 11-326."
5	SECTION 2. Section 11-336, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
7	"(a) The filing dates for preliminary reports are:
8	(1) Ten calendar days prior to a primary, <u>each</u> special, or
9	each nonpartisan election; [and]
10	(2) September 30 of the election year; and
11	$\left[\frac{(2)}{(3)}\right]$ Ten calendar days prior to a general election.
12	Each preliminary report shall be current through the fifth
13	calendar day prior to the filing of the report."
14	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
15	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
