SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY, THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS, AND THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS TO CONSIDER WHETHER THEY SHOULD ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING TO DEVELOP A COMMUNITY-BASED PROGRAM FOR OFFENDERS ON HAWAII ISLAND.

1 WHEREAS, under the comprehensive offender reentry system, 2 the Department of Public Safety is authorized to purchase 3 service contracts for adult offender reentry programs and 4 services that establish or improve the offender reentry system 5 and in which each adult offender in state correctional custody 6 is provided an individualized reentry plan; and

8 WHEREAS, among the programs and services that may be 9 offered by the Department of Public Safety are community-based 10 programs which, unlike institution-based programs, reentry 11 programs, or reintegration programs, are programs that are 12 administered and operated outside of a correctional facility; 13 and

WHEREAS, generally, community-based programs are administered and operated by community agencies, faith-based organizations, non-profit organizations, and other similar entities, as opposed to state or other government agencies; and 19

20 WHEREAS, an alternative to the purchase of service 21 contracts with community agencies and similar entities would be 22 a memorandum of understanding with the Department of Hawaiian 23 Home Lands, for the administration and operation of a community-24 based program; and 25

WHEREAS, the Land Management Division of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands is the division responsible for the management of the Department's lands that are not homestead lands, and are not required to be used only for homestead purposes, but may be used for other department operations; and

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2 WHEREAS, the Office of Hawaiian Affairs has recently looked 3 at the disparate treatment of native Hawaiians in our judicial system and has expressed concern at the number of native 4 5 Hawaiians who are incarcerated; now, therefore, 6 7 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the 8 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 9 Public Safety, Department of Hawaiian Home Lands, and Office of 10 Hawaiian Affairs are requested to consider whether they should 11 enter into a memorandum of understanding to develop a 12

13 community-based reentry program for offenders on Hawaii Island; 14 and

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Public Safety, 17 Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission, and Chair of the 18 Board of Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs are 19 requested to submit a report of their findings and 20 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 21 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 22 the Regular Session of 2012; and

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Public 26 Safety, Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission, and Chair 27 of the Board of Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs.

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
