SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF AN ADVISORY GROUP TO DEVELOP INITIATIVES TO MAKE THE USE OF IMPORTANT AGRICULTURAL LANDS FOR SUSTAINABILITY AND SELF-SUFFICIENCY PURPOSES A PRIORITY.

WHEREAS, Hawaii has limited lands suitable for agricultural 1 2 use; and 3 WHEREAS, the 1978 Constitutional Convention mandated 4 5 protection of important agricultural lands; and 6 WHEREAS, section 3, Article XI, of the Constitution of the 7 8 State of Hawaii requires the State to conserve and protect 9 agricultural lands, promote diversified agriculture, increase agricultural self-sufficiency and assure the availability of 10 11 agriculturally suitable lands, and to provide standards and criteria to accomplish those ends; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the recent rezoning of agricultural lands at Koa 14 Ridge by the Land Use Commission increases pressure to protect 15 remaining agricultural lands and reduces the possibility of 16 17 increasing agricultural self-sufficiency; and 18

19 WHEREAS, chapter 205, Hawaii Revised Statutes, established
20 the Land Use Commission within the Department of Business,
21 Economic Development and Tourism for administrative purposes;
22 and

24 WHEREAS, the Land Use Commission reviews petitions to 25 reclassify district boundaries; and

WHEREAS, Act 183, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, amended chapter 205, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to add a new part relating to important agricultural lands to provide policies, definitions and objectives, and standards and criteria for reclassification or rezoning, among other things, by the Land Use Commission; and

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2 WHEREAS, the original intent and functions of the Land Use 3 Commission have been criticized as subverting land use approvals 4 in favor of the constituencies of development, and shutting out 5 the public from the process; and 6

7 WHEREAS, each of the four counties have different 8 definitions of agricultural use (for example, section 174C-3, 9 Hawaii Revised Statutes, defines "agricultural use" in relation 10 to the State Water Code only) which together, do not direct the 11 State to increase its self-sufficiency and sustainability; and 12

WHEREAS, sustainability and self-sufficiency have become
ideas discussed in the public forum, such as at the Hawaii 2050
Sustainability Task Force conference; and

WHEREAS, the state Department of Agriculture is tasked under section 205-49, Hawaii Revised Statutes, with recommending to the Land Use Commission the identification and designation of important agricultural lands, but the Department of Agriculture has no jurisdiction over the zoning of agricultural lands; and

WHEREAS, real property taxes on agricultural lands aredetermined by each county; and

26 WHEREAS, the support and promotion of important
27 agricultural lands for self-sufficiency and sustainability are
28 addressed by multiple government entities; and

WHEREAS, coordination among state entities is necessary to
 support the use of agricultural lands to increase the State's
 agricultural self-sufficiency and sustainability; and

WHEREAS, statewide initiatives on the use of agricultural
lands are necessary if the State is to increase its selfsufficiency and sustainability; and

38 WHEREAS, an assessment and identification of what statewide 39 initiatives that would support self-sufficiency and 40 sustainability are necessary; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth
Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the
House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of

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6 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the advisory group be headed by 8 the Department of Agriculture; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the advisory group comprise 11 representatives from the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, the Department of Land and Natural 12 Resources, and the Department of Agriculture, a representative 13 14 from each of the four counties, and representatives from other 15 entities such as the Ulupono Initiative, Kanu Hawaii, and the 16 Hawaii Agriculture Research Center; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the advisory group meet with 19 government and private entities and hold public meetings which are subject to Chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 20 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the advisory group report to 23 the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening 24 of the Regular Session of 2012 with: 25 26 (1)Findings, recommended initiatives, and proposed 27 legislation to support self-sufficiency and sustainability using agricultural lands; 28 29 30 (2) A proposed statutory definition of "farm"; and 31 32 (3) A prioritized listing of statewide agricultural activities focusing on producing food for local 33 consumers; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 36 37 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture; the Director of Business, Economic 38 Development, and Tourism; the Chairperson of the Board of Land 39 40 and Natural Resources; the Mayor of each county; and the heads 41

Agriculture is requested to convene an advisory group to develop

a list of initiatives, especially including changes to county

zoning, government subsidies, and private-public partnerships,
