SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A TASK FORCE TO RECOMMEND A PROCESS TO CREATE A CITIZEN ROAD WATCH PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, according to the City and County of Honolulu 1 Police Department, as of November 2010, traffic fatalities on 2 Oahu exceeded the number of traffic fatalities that occurred on 3 Oahu in all of 2009; and 4 5 WHEREAS, as of November 2010, speed was a factor in over 6 forty per cent of traffic fatalities on Oahu; and 7 8 WHEREAS, in 2010, Oahu experienced almost two times the 9 number of pedestrian deaths than in 2009; and 10 11 WHEREAS, many of these pedestrian fatalities involved 12 individuals using a marked crosswalk; and 13 14 WHEREAS, in an effort to reduce speeding in residential 15 areas, a number of communities in other states have established 16 programs to engage local residents in changing driver behavior 17 on their neighborhood streets; and 18 19 WHEREAS, for instance, neighborhood speed watch programs in 20 communities in Arizona, Florida, Maryland, Utah, Washington, and 21 Ontario, Canada train residents on how to use radar equipment 22 and collect speed data in their neighborhoods; and 23 24 WHEREAS, participating residents record the speed and 25 license plate information of speeding motor vehicles and send 26 this information to the owner of the vehicle, informing the 27 owner of the violation and encouraging the owner or driver of 28 the vehicle to drive at or below the posted speed limit; and 29 30 WHEREAS, the Road Watch program in Richmond Hill in 31 Ontario, Canada gives residents an opportunity to report 32



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aggressive and unsafe driving in their neighborhoods to the 1 police through the use of Citizen Report forms; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, this information assists the police in identifying 5 unsafe driving acts or "hot spots" that are traffic problem 6 areas; and 7 8 WHEREAS, a similar initiative in Hawaii could help deter speeding in local neighborhoods by raising public awareness of 9 the issue and educating drivers about the negative consequences 10 11 of speeding; now, therefore, 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the 14 House of Representatives concurring, that the President of the 15 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives are 16 requested to convene a task force to recommend a process to 17 create a Citizen Road Watch program; and 18 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be composed of: 21 22 (1)One member of the Senate appointed by the President of 23 the Senate; 24 25 (2) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House; 26 27 28 (3)The Director of Transportation or the Director's 29 designee; 30 31 (4)The Director of the Honolulu Department of 32 Transportation Services or the Director's designee; 33 34 (5) The City and County of Honolulu Prosecuting Attorney 35 or the Prosecuting Attorney's designee; 36 The State Public Defender or the Public Defender's 37 (6) 38 designee; 39 40 (7) The City and County of Honolulu Police Chief or the 41 Police Chief's designee; 42



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(8) The Executive Director of the Oahu Metropolitan Planning Organization or the Executive Director's designee;

- (9) One representative of the Oahu Neighborhood Boards appointed by the President of the Senate; and
- (10) One representative of the Oahu Neighborhood Boards appointed by the Speaker of the House; and

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 12 submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the 13 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 14 the Regular Session of 2012; and

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 17 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the 18 Director of Transportation, the Honolulu Prosecuting Attorney, 19 the State Public Defender, the Honolulu Police Chief, the 20 Director of the Honolulu Department of Transportation Services, 21 and the Executive Director of the Oahu Metropolitan Planning 22 23 Organization. 24
