## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

EXTENDING THE DEADLINE FOR THE HOME FOR LIFE TASK FORCE TO REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR REDUCING BARRIERS TO AGING IN PLACE AND FACILITATING MULTIGENERATIONAL LIVING.

WHEREAS, Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 7, S.D. 1 (2009) 1 2 requested the President of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and Governor to establish the Home for Life 3 Task Force (Task Force) to coordinate research and action to 4 reduce barriers to aging in place and to facilitate 5 multigenerational or accessible living, pursuant to the 6 recommendation of the Joint Legislative Committee on Aging in 7 8 Place; and

10 WHEREAS, Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 7, S.D. 1 (2009) 11 also requested the President of the Senate, Speaker of the House 12 of Representatives, and Governor to each appoint six members of 13 the Task Force comprising individuals from designated entities 14 and agencies involved in providing services in furtherance of 15 aging in place; and

WHEREAS, the President of the Senate and Speaker of theHouse of Representatives each appointed six members, yet theGovernor had not appointed anyone; and

21 WHEREAS, the delay in the appointment of members meant the 22 Task Force could not begin or complete its work; therefore 23 during the 2010 Regular Session, the Senate and the House of 24 Representatives adopted House Concurrent Resolution No. 13 25 (2010), authorizing an extension of the reporting deadline 26 applicable to the Task Force; and

WHEREAS, the Task Force convened its first meeting on June 30, 2010, a date significantly later than anticipated due to the absence of gubernatorial representatives; and



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WHEREAS, the Task Force has diligently met six times since 1 beginning its work; however, the members feel their findings are 2 only in the preliminary stages; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Task Force is not yet in a position to make 5 comprehensive, systematic recommendations, or propose 6 legislation; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the current deadline for the Task Force to report 9 to the Legislature its findings and recommendations is twenty 10 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Task Force has completed an interim report, 13 but not a final report; and 14 15 WHEREAS, to continue work on the unresolved issues, an 16 extension of the reporting deadline for the Task Force's final 17 report is required; now, therefore, 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 20 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the 21 House of Representatives concurring, that the deadline for the 22 Home for Life Task Force to report its findings and 23 recommendations to the Legislature be extended to June 30, 2012; 24 25 and 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 27 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, President 28 of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, Director 29 of Health, Director of Human Services, Director of the Executive 30 Office on Aging, Executive Director of the Building Code 31 Council, Comptroller, Executive Director of the Hawaii Housing 32 Finance and Development Corporation, Licensing Administrator for 33 the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs Professional and 34 Vocational Licensing Division, Executive Director of the 35 Disability and Communication Access Board, President of the 36 University of Hawaii System, Executive Director of the Legal Aid 37 Society of Hawaii, President of the Building Industry 38 Association of Hawaii, and Mayor of each county. 39 40 41 42 43

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
