## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING A COMPREHENSIVE FINANCIAL AND MANAGEMENT AUDIT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION'S OPERATIONS.

WHEREAS, there have been numerous legislative measures 1 passed and other actions taken to help improve Hawaii's failing 2 public school system; and 3 4 WHEREAS, a child enrolled in Hawaii's public school system 5 is just as capable of achieving educational success as any other 6 child enrolled in any other public school system in this nation; 7 and 8 9 WHEREAS, Hawaii's public school teachers are just as 10 proficient and capable as other public school teachers in the 11 12 nation; and 13 WHEREAS, the Department of Education, in 2010, received a 14 quarter of the State's general fund appropriations, the largest 15 of any state agency; and 16 17 WHEREAS, The Department of Education's funding in 2008 was 18 over \$2.5 billion. In 2009, it was almost \$2.6 billion. During 19 the recession in 2010, it was well over \$2.4 billion; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, according to the 2010 Superintendent's 21<sup>ST</sup> Annual Report, per student costs continued to increase from \$8,997 per 23 student in 2005, to \$9,876 per student in 2006, to \$11,060 per 24 student in 2007; and 25 26 WHEREAS, according to the Superintendent's Report, the 27 national assessment of student progress in targeted grade levels 28 confirms that many Hawaii public school students generally score 29 below the national average in reading and mathematics; and 30 31 32 WHEREAS, PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP, an independent accounting firm, said in a 2005 audit of Department of Education 33

are denied potentially valuable information, and some may be 1 basing their fiscal decisions on flawed data;" and 2 3 WHEREAS, the Department of Education's last comprehensive 4 audit of the entire organization, management processes, and 5 personnel administration happened thirty-eight years ago, in 6 1973; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the Department of Education's spending, 9 administrative, and managerial practices need to be reviewed and 10 resolved before an increase in funding from the Legislature is 11 warranted; now, therefore, 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 14 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the 15 House of Representatives concurring, that the Office of the 16 Auditor conduct a comprehensive financial and management audit 17 of the Department of Education; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the results of the Office of 20 the Auditor's audit of the Department of Education, along with 21 findings and recommendations, be reported to the Hawaii State 22 Legislature and the governor at least twenty days prior to the 23 beginning of the 2012 legislative session; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 26 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Office of the 27 Auditor, the Department of Education, and the Board of 28 Education. 29 30 31 32 OFFERED/ BY: Theread Ka
