SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO COLLABORATE WITH PARENT ORGANIZATIONS TO DEVELOP STATEWIDE POLICIES FOR FAMILY ENGAGEMENT FOR HAWAII'S PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that family engagement is an
important predictor of student success and is important in a
child's cognitive, social, and emotional development; and

5 WHEREAS, children benefit from family engagement in their 6 schools, including at the early childhood, elementary, middle or 7 intermediate, and high school levels; and

9 WHEREAS, family engagement helps close educational gaps 10 between children of different socioeconomic backgrounds; and 11

12 WHEREAS, family engagement in public education can help to 13 create policies, strategies, and practices that support learning 14 and improve student achievement; and

16 WHEREAS, Hawaii is one of ten states identified by the 17 National PTA that do not have statutes pertaining to family 18 engagement in school; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Board of Education and Department of Education are requested to collaborate with parent organizations to develop policies for family engagement for public schools; and

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education and 28 Department of Education are requested to report their findings 29 and make legislative recommendations to facilitate family 30 engagement to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to 31 the convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and



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2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 3 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 4 Board of Education and Superintendent of Education. 5
