SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS TO RELEASE PASTORAL AND AGRICULTURAL LEASES TO ITS BENEFICIARIES AND REPORT STATISTICAL DATA RELATED TO IMPLEMENTATION OF ARTICLE XII, SECTION 1 OF THE HAWAII STATE CONSTITUTION.

WHEREAS, native Hawaiians have traditionally had close ties 1 2 to the land; and 3 WHEREAS, after contact with the West: 4 5 Native Hawaiians' traditional ties to their lands were 6 (1)7 disrupted; and 8 9 (2) The size of the native Hawaiian population began to decrease because of the introduction of new illnesses 10 11 and diseases to which native Hawaiians had not 12 previously been exposed; and 13 WHEREAS, it was and continues to be widely believed that 14 15 one way to improve the condition of native Hawaiians is to provide them with greater access to ancestral lands; and 16 17 WHEREAS, as Hawaii's delegate to the United States 18 Congress, Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalanianaole spearheaded the 19 passage of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, designed to 20 create a rehabilitation program for the dwindling numbers of 21 22 native Hawaiians; and 23 24 WHEREAS, in 1921, with the enactment of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, the United States set aside approximately 25 200,000 acres of land to establish a permanent homeland for 26 native Hawaiians, who were a landless and "dying" people; and 27 28



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1 WHEREAS, the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, was 2 subsequently incorporated into the Hawaii State Constitution; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands was 6 established by the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, and is headed by an executive board known as the Hawaiian Homes 7 8 Commission; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands owes a 11 fiduciary duty to its beneficiaries; and 12 13 WHEREAS, it is essential that the beneficiaries of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands gain access to lands set aside 14 15 for them as expeditiously as possible; and 16 17 WHEREAS, pastoral and agricultural leases are an important, valuable, and viable use of Hawaiian Home Lands; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, the court in Lum v. Hawaiian Homes Commission, Civil No. 09-1-2332-10 (1st Cir. Ct. Haw., Oct. 10, 2010), 21 22 ordered the Hawaiian Homes Commission to adopt rules pursuant to 23 chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, before awarding any further pastoral homestead lands; now, therefore, 24 25 26 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 27 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 28 Hawaiian Home Lands is urged to take immediate action to comply 29 with the court order in Lum v. Hawaiian Homes Commission, and to 30 resume releasing pastoral and agricultural leases to its 31 beneficiaries as soon as possible; and 32 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands is requested to provide: 35 36 37 (1)The following data or statistics for the period 2000 38 through 2010 on the number of: 39 40 (A) Homestead awards reported to the Legislature (if there is a discrepancy with the appropriate 41 annual report, an explanation shall be provided), 42 43 and a breakdown for each year in each of the
