SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING OPPOSITION TO A CONGRESSIONAL HEARING ON MUSLIM RADICALIZATION.

1 WHEREAS, despite opposition by civil rights organizations, 2 faith-based groups, and his own colleagues in the United States 3 House of Representatives, the Chairperson of the House Committee 4 on Homeland Security held a hearing on March 10, 2011, entitled 5 "The Extent of Radicalization in the American Muslim Community 6 and that Community's Response"; and

8 WHEREAS, the Chairperson of the House Committee on Homeland 9 Security justified holding of the hearing on the grounds of 10 national security; and

12 WHEREAS, civil rights organizations and faith-based groups 13 expressed concerns over the singling out of a group of Americans 14 based on their faith, noting that the hearings would demonize 15 American Muslims, denigrate their religion, and question their 16 patriotism; and

18 WHEREAS, the Chairperson's congressional colleagues
19 expressed their concern over the narrow scope and unfair
20 stigmatization and alienation of Muslim Americans; and

22 WHEREAS, the Chairperson's actions and his justification 23 for those actions are reminiscent of the prejudice, hysteria, 24 and failure in political leadership that led to one of America's 25 most shameful periods in history, namely, the evacuation, 26 relocation, and imprisonment of American citizens of Japanese 27 ancestry; now, therefore,

29 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 30 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the 31 House of Representatives concurring, that the Legislature 32 expresses its opposition to the hearing on March 19, 2011, on
