SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO CREATE A TASK FORCE TO STUDY AND RECOMMEND PROPOSED LEGISLATION REQUIRING THE COUNTIES TO TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR CERTAIN DISPUTED ROADS THAT ARE NOT BEING MAINTAINED.

WHEREAS, it is often difficult for tenants, landlords, and
 other interested parties to ascertain information about
 ownership of certain rights-of-way, which is important for
 issues relating to maintenance, improvement, and liability; and

6 WHEREAS, many government and homestead roads were created 7 during the Territory of Hawaii, and after statehood, the State 8 of Hawaii awarded jurisdiction of some government and homestead 9 roads to the counties; and

11 WHEREAS, since that time, many roads have taken on 12 uncertain status and jurisdiction because they were laid out by 13 government, but are not part of the state highway system and are 14 not currently maintained by county government; and

16 WHEREAS, these roads of uncertain status and jurisdiction 17 were never improved or upgraded to acceptable standards before 18 being transferred to the counties, and no funding was provided 19 for their maintenance after transfer; and

21 WHEREAS, for years, these roads have been an issue between 22 the State and the counties over who should maintain the roads, 23 pay for the costs of their maintenance and improvement, and 24 assume liability for injuries and damages incurred on them; and 25

26 WHEREAS, according to a 1989 Legislative Reference Bureau
27 report entitled *Roads in Limbo: Analysis of the State-County*28 Jurisdictional Dispute: "The State and Counties have been at an
29 impasse over this conflict, and neither side is willing to take

jurisdiction over these roads with their concomitant expense for 1 2 maintenance, upgrading and repair"; and 3 4 WHEREAS, residents who need to use these roads suffer when roadway jurisdiction is in dispute because these roads are less 5 6 likely to be cared for than roads over which there is no 7 jurisdictional dispute; and 8 9 WHEREAS, although the State transferred these roads to the 10 counties, the counties, in turn, claim the transfer amounted to an unfunded state mandate because the State has never provided 11 the counties with funds with which to maintain roads that the 12 13 counties did not create; and 14 WHEREAS, according to the Legislative Reference Bureau's 15 16 report, the standoff on maintenance of roads in limbo has "the practical effect of leaving a significant number of roads in all 17 four counties in substandard conditions and without routine 18 maintenance because no government body will accept 19 responsibility for them"; now, therefore, 20 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 23 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 24 Transportation is requested to create a task force to explore 25 the feasibility of transferring to the counties responsibility 26 for roads that are not currently being maintained and the means 27 28 by which the counties may meet that responsibility, including 29 estimated costs and possible funding sources; and 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 31 32 Transportation is requested to compose the task force of the following members: 33 34 The Director of Transportation, who is requested to 35 (1)serve as Chairperson; 36 37 (2) The Director of the Office of Planning, or the 38 Director's designee; 39 40 (3) The mayor of each of the counties, or the mayors' 41 42 designees; 43

and County of Honolulu, or the Director's designee; 2 3 4 (5) The Chief Engineer of the Department of Public Works of the County of Hawaii; 5 6 7 (6)The County Engineer of the Department of Public Works 8 of the County of Kauai; and 9 10 (7) The County Engineer of the Department of Public Works 11 of the County of Maui; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 14 Transportation is requested to submit to the Legislature, no 15 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular 16 Session of 2012, a report of the findings and recommendations of 17 the task force, including any proposed legislation; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of _ 20 Transportation; the Director of the Office of Planning; the 21 22 Mayor of each of the counties; the Chairperson of each County Council; the Director of Transportation Services of the City and 23 County of Honolulu; the Chief Engineer of the Department of 24 25 Public Works of the County of Hawaii; the County Engineer of the Department of Public Works of the County of Kauai; and the 26 County Engineer of the Department of Public Works of the County 27 of Maui. 28 29 30 31 OFFERED BY: CALA
