SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR TO WITHDRAW CERTAIN EXECUTIVE ORDERS SETTING ASIDE PUBLIC LANDS WHERE THE RECEIVING AGENCY HAS FAILED TO USE OR HAS UNDERUTILIZED THE LANDS FOR THE PURPOSE SPECIFIED.

1 WHEREAS, pursuant to section 171-11, Hawaii Revised
2 Statutes, the Governor may, with the prior approval of the Board
3 of Land and Natural Resources, set aside public lands to any
4 department or agency of the State or its political subdivisions
5 ("Receiving Agency") for public use or purpose; and

7 WHEREAS, section 171-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, also 8 provides that whenever land set aside for a public purpose to a 9 Receiving Agency is not being fully utilized or required for the 10 stated public purpose, the order setting aside the land shall be 11 withdrawn and the lands shall be returned to the Department of 12 Land and Natural Resources; and

14 WHEREAS, the Governor may also withdraw public lands and, 15 with the prior approval of the Board of Land and Natural 16 Resources, set aside the withdrawn lands to another Receiving 17 Agency or to the United States; provided that no structure on 18 such lands shall be built, demolished, or altered until after 19 the legislative action or inaction as described in section 20 171-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and

22 WHEREAS, many of the Governor's executive orders setting aside public lands provide that in the event of the non-use or 23 abandonment of the land or any portion thereof for a continuous 24 period of one year, the Receiving Agency shall, within a 25 reasonable time, restore the premises to a condition that is 26 satisfactory and acceptable to the Department of Land and 27 Natural Resources, and return the land or portions thereof back 28 to the inventory of the Department of Land and Natural 29 Resources; and 30 31



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WHEREAS, in a number of cases, the Receiving Agency has 1 failed to use or has underutilized public lands set aside by 2 executive order for the purpose specified in the executive order 3 4 for periods of more than one year; and 5 WHEREAS, the recession of 2008 swept across the nation and 6 many parts of the world with unanticipated force and brought 7 with it enormous challenges for governments at all levels, with 8 effects on businesses and employment that are still being felt 9 today, including a profound impact on Hawaii's tax revenues and 10 state budget; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that due to the 13 extraordinary fiscal circumstances the State is facing, set-14 asides of public lands must be re-evaluated to ensure that such 15 lands are being fully utilized, and that any unused or 16 underutilized lands are put into productive use wherever 17 possible; now, therefore, 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 20 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the 21 House of Representatives concurring, that the Governor is urged 22 to withdraw the following executive orders that set aside public 23 land to various departments of the State, Hawaii National Guard, 24 or County of Hawaii and return the public land to the inventory 25 of the Department of Land and Natural Resources: 26 27 28 (1)Executive Order No. 614, and that 5.970 acres in Olaa Village, Keaau, Puna, Hawaii, currently set aside to 29 the Department of Education; 30 31 Executive Order No. 1110, and that 4.0 acres in Olaa (2) 32 Village, Puna, Hawaii, currently set aside to the 33 Hawaii National Guard; 34 35 (3) Executive Order No. 1426, and that 492.5 acres in 36 Waiakea, South Hilo, Hawaii, currently set aside to 37 the Department of Public Safety; 38 39 Executive Order No. 1623, and that 5,810 square feet (4)40 in Holualoa, North Kona, Hawaii, currently set aside 41 to the County of Hawaii; 42 43



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Executive Order No. 2371, and that 2.392 acres in (5) 1 Honokaa, Hawaii, currently set aside to the Department 2 of Accounting and General Services; 3 4 Executive Order No. 2748, and that 0.75 acres in 5 (6) Waimea, South Kohala, Hawaii, currently set aside to 6 7 the County of Hawaii; and 8 Executive Order No. 3074, and that 4,204.1 acres in 9 (7) Keahole, North Kona, Hawaii, currently set aside to 10 the Department of Transportation; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in cases where a Receiving 13 Agency that is identified above requires public land for its 14 operations but does not require the full amount of land set 15 aside to it by the applicable executive order listed above, the 16 agency may apply to the Department of Land and Natural Resources 17 for an executive order covering a land area that is adequate to 18 meet its needs; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 21 Natural Resources initiate a further review and assessment of 22 existing executive orders to determine whether the Receiving 23 Agencies are fully utilizing the lands set aside to them; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 26 Natural Resources report its findings and recommendations to the 27 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the Regular 28 Session of 2012; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 31 Natural Resources examine the development potential for any 32 public land returned to its inventory as a result of the 33 withdrawal of the executive orders listed above; and 34 35 36



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor,
 Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources,
 Chairperson of the Board of Education, Director of Public
 Safety, Comptroller, Director of Transportation, Mayor of the
 County of Hawaii, and Hawaii National Guard.
