## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE APPROVAL, PLANNING, AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE LEGISLATURE'S PROPOSAL FOR THE INSTALLATION OF PHYTOREMEDIATION TECHNOLOGY IN THE REFLECTING PONDS SURROUNDING THE STATE CAPITOL.

WHEREAS, the reflecting ponds surrounding the State Capitol 1 have leaked stagnant water into the chamber level of the State 2 Capitol in the past, including in 2008, and will probably do so 3 again; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the reflecting ponds were built without adequate 6 filtration, thus preventing the stocking of fish to control 7 algae growth; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, the growth of algae in the reflecting ponds has become an unsightly problem; and 11 12 WHEREAS, with their uneven bottoms, the reflecting ponds 13 are difficult to clean properly; and 14 15 WHEREAS, it takes three janitors working ten half-days per 16 month using enzymes and pumps to control algae growth in the 17 reflecting ponds; and 18 19 WHEREAS, in a time of a state budget crisis, it costs more 20 than \$50,000 per year, not including electricity costs, to 21 maintain the reflecting ponds; and 22 23 WHEREAS, commercial phytoremediation, using plants to 24 remove hazardous or environmentally destructive substances from 25 the environment, is a technology that is gaining acceptance in 26 27 commercial marketplaces and offers a low cost, non-toxic technique suitable for a variety of contaminated environments, 28 including the clean-up of marine environments; and 29 30



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WHEREAS, phytoremediation technology is currently being 1 explored as a form of best management practices for restoring 2 impaired coastal waters, harbors, and drainages to improve and 3 maintain water quality for public health and environmental 4 protection; and 5 6 WHEREAS, phytoremediation technology may also be useful for 7 remediating the reflecting ponds and reducing the algae in the 8 reflecting ponds through the installation of floating clusters 9 of Hawaiian native plants; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the State Capitol is listed on the Hawaii and 12 National Registers of Historic Places; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the reflecting ponds are considered an 15 architectural feature of the State Capitol; and 16 17 WHEREAS, any proposal to alter the architectural features 18 of a property listed on the Hawaii or National Register of 19 Historic Places must be submitted to the State Historic 20 21 Preservation Division of the Department of Land and Natural Resources for review; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the State Capitol is located in the Hawaii Capital 24 Special Design District and the City and County of Honolulu's 25 Department of Planning and Permitting must approve of any 26 changes; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, section 6E-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is the principal statutory provision addressing the review of the 30 effects of proposed state projects for properties designated as 31 historic; and 32 33 WHEREAS, the management of the State Capitol building falls 34 under the jurisdiction of the Department of Accounting and 35 General Services; and 36 37 WHEREAS, any proposal to install phytoremediation 38 technology in the reflecting ponds may be accomplished under 39 existing statutes and regulations; now, therefore, 40 41 42 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the 43 House of Representatives concurring, that the State Historic 44 2011-0696 SCR SMA.doc 

Preservation Division of the Department of Land and Natural 1 Resources is requested to treat this measure as the 2 Legislature's proposal for the installation of phytoremediation 3 technology in the reflecting ponds; and 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Historic Preservation 6 7 Division of the Department of Land and Natural Resources is also requested to approve the proposed installation of 8 9 phytoremediation technology in the reflecting ponds; and 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Accounting 11 and General Services is requested to develop a plan to implement 12 13 this proposal; and 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Historic Preservation 15 Division of the Department of Land and Natural Resources is also 16 requested to cooperate with the Department of Accounting and 17 General Services in developing a plan to implement this 18 proposal; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Accounting 21 and General Services and the State Historic Preservation 22 Division of the Department of Land and Natural Resources are 23 requested to seek any required approvals from the City and 24 County of Honolulu's Department of Planning and Permitting, the 25 26 National Register of Historic Places, and any other appropriate agency; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Accounting 29 30 and General Services is requested to implement the plan once the required approvals are obtained; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Accounting 33 and General Services and the State Historic Preservation 34 Division of the Department of Land and Natural Resources report 35 to the Legislature on their progress no later than twenty days 36 prior to the convening of each regular session until the project 37 is completed; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 40 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 41 42 Board of Land and Natural Resources, Administrator of the State Historic Preservation Division of the Department of Land and 43

Natural Resources, Comptroller, Director of the City and County



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of Honolulu's Department of Planning and Permitting, Program Manager of the National Register of Historic Places, and United States Secretary of the Interior.
