SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

DECLARING THE MONTH OF MAY OF EACH YEAR AS LUPUS AWARENESS MONTH IN HAWAII.

WHEREAS, systemic lupus erythematosus, commonly known as 1 lupus, is an immune system disorder of unknown cause and in its 2 systemic form may affect the joints, skin, and one or more 3 internal organs, such as the kidney, heart, and brain; and 4 5 WHEREAS, lupus is a chronic, complex, and life-threatening 6 7 disease in which there is always the potential threat of serious illness and disability; and 8 9 WHEREAS, while lupus can occur in men, ninety percent of 10 the sufferers are women in their childbearing years, 11 particularly affecting native Hawaiian women, Pacific Island 12 13 women, and women of Asian descent; and 14 15 WHEREAS, ordinarily, the immune system protects against infection by producing antibodies that successfully combat 16 foreign infectious agents, but in people with lupus, the immune 17 system produces antibodies that can harm the individual's own 18 body; and 19 20 WHEREAS, people with lupus have many different symptoms, 21 but the most common are fatigue, muscle and joint pain, skin 22 disorders, and inflammation of internal organs or the vascular 23 and nervous systems; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, early detection and proper treatment are critical to the quality of life and survival rate of lupus sufferers; and 27 28 WHEREAS, researchers estimate that over 1,500,000 people in 29 the United States have been diagnosed with a form of lupus or 30 related disease and according to Lupus Hawaii, over 10,000 31 people in Hawaii are affected by lupus; and 32



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2 WHEREAS, scientists in biology, biochemistry, immunology,
3 genetics, and other fields are seeking to understand the causes
4 of lupus and to develop better means of detection, treatment,
5 and prevention; and

7 WHEREAS, new research and new approaches to diagnosis and 8 treatment are needed to fight lupus, and the suffering of lupus 9 victims can be alleviated through patient services and the 10 promotion of early detection of undiagnosed cases through lupus 11 awareness programs; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Legislature proclaim the month of May of each year as "Lupus Awareness Month" in Hawaii; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and the
Director of Health.
