SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF AN ACADEMIC SYMPOSIUM TO CONSIDER THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE UNIVERSITY WITHIN THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I SYSTEM.

1 WHEREAS, in a first-ever address to the 2010 Legislature on 2 the State of the University of Hawai'i, President M.R.C. 3 Greenwood stated that the University is "committed to supporting 4 the access and success of Native Hawaiians. We are making 5 headway and we are fortunate to have partners along this path"; 6 and

8 WHEREAS, the Board of Regents of the University of Hawai'i System, through its policies, states that as the only provider 9 of public higher education in Hawai'i, the University embraces 10 its unique responsibilities to the indigenous people of Hawai'i 11 and to Hawai'i's indigenous language and culture; and to fulfill 12 this responsibility, the University ensures active support for 13 the participation of Native Hawaiians at the University and 14 supports vigorous programs of study and support for the Hawaiian 15 language, history, and culture; and 16 17

18 WHEREAS, the University of Hawai'i, through the President,
19 working with the Chancellors, ensures that the unique commitment
20 to Native Hawaiians is fulfilled; and

WHEREAS, in part, this commitment includes providing 22 positive systemwide executive support in the development, 23 implementation, and improvement of programs and services for 24 25 Native Hawaiians; providing for and promoting the use of the Hawaiian language within the University of Hawai'i System; 26 providing a level of support for the study of Hawaiian language, 27 culture, and history within the University of Hawai'i System that 28 29 honors, perpetuates, and strengthens those disciplines; and 30

31 WHEREAS, the Puko'a Council of the University of Hawai'i was 32 chartered in June 2009, to provide a formal, independent voice



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and organization through which the Native Hawaiian faculty, 1 administrators, and students of the University of Hawai'i System 2 3 can participate in the development and interpretation of 4 systemwide policy and practice as it relates to Native Hawaiian programs, activities, initiatives, and issues; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, the Puko'a Council is comprised of representatives 8 from each of the councils of each campus in the University system: Hanakahi Council, University of Hawai'i at Hilo; 9 Hoʻolulu Council, Hawaiʻi Community College; Kahikoluamea 10 Council, Kapi'olani Community College; Ke Kumupali Council, 11 Windward Community College; Kuali'i Council, University of Hawaii 12 at Manoa; Kupu Ka Wai Council, Honolulu Community College; 13 Lau'ulu Council, Maui Community College; Makaloa Council, Kaua'i 14 15 Community College; Puko'a no Na 'Ewa, Leeward Community College; and Nalimakui Council, University of Hawai'i - West O'ahu; and 16 17 WHEREAS, Hawai'i is the only state in the United States that 18 has designated a native language, and a 2000 United States 19 Census report noted that the Hawaiian language is the only 20 native language in the nation that has grown in terms of fluent 21 22 speakers; and 23 24 WHEREAS, this is due in great part to the University of Hawai'i System, which provides numerous programs and both 25 26 undergraduate and graduate degrees in Hawaiian language studies; now, therefore, 27 28 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 29 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the 30 31 House of Representatives concurring, that the President of the University of Hawai'i System is requested to convene an academic 32 symposium to consider the establishment of a Hawaiian Language 33 University within the University of Hawai'i System; and 34 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in planning for the symposium, the President consult with the Puko'a Council and representatives 37 from the Hawaiian language studies programs on all campuses; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the symposium be held at a time 40 and place to ensure maximum participation by faculty, students, 41 42 and others from the University of Hawai'i System; private and 2011-1280 SCR SMA-1.doc

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public educational organizations and other entities committed to 1 the advancement of the Hawaiian language; and interested members 2 3 of the community; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the symposium consider at minimum, the following issues related to establishment of a 6 Hawaiian Language University within the University of Hawai'i 7 System: the mission; governance and administration; curriculum 8 and degrees; facilities and technology requirements; financial 9 and other resources available or to be obtained; a timetable for 10 implementation, and any other issues, as appropriate; and 11 12

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the University 13 of Hawai'i System report to the Legislature and the Governor no 14 15 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2012 on the findings of the symposium and the 16 recommendations related to establishment of a Hawaiian Language 17 18 University within the University of Hawai'i System; and 19

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 21 Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, President of 22 23 the University of Hawai'i System, and the Board of Regents of the 24 University of Hawai'i.
