## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE REPUBLIC OF TURKEY TO UPHOLD AND SAFEGUARD RELIGIOUS AND HUMAN RIGHTS, TO CEASE DISCRIMINATION AGAINST THE ECUMENICAL PATRIARCHATE, TO GRANT THE ECUMENICAL PATRIARCH APPROPRIATE ECUMENICAL RECOGNITION, ECCLESIASTIC SUCCESSION, AND THE RIGHT TO TRAIN CLERGY OF ALL NATIONALITIES, AND TO RESPECT THE PROPERTY RIGHTS, HUMAN RIGHTS, AND RELIGIOUS RIGHTS OF THE ECUMENICAL PATRIARCHATE.

WHEREAS, the Ecumenical Patriarchate, located in Istanbul,
 Turkey, is the Sacred See that presides in a spirit of
 brotherhood over a communion of self-governing churches of the
 Orthodox Christian world; and

6 WHEREAS, the See is led by Ecumenical Patriarch
7 Bartholomew, who is the 270<sup>th</sup> in direct succession to the Apostle
8 Andrew and holds titular primacy as primus inter pares, meaning
9 "first among equals," in the community of Orthodox Christian
10 churches worldwide; and

WHEREAS, in 1994, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, along with leaders of the Appeal of Conscience Foundation, cosponsored the Conference on Peace and Tolerance, which brought together Christian, Jewish, and Muslim religious leaders for an interfaith dialogue to help end the Balkan conflict and the ethnic conflict in the Caucasus region; and

WHEREAS, in 1997, the Congress of the United States awardedEcumenical Patriarch Bartholomew with the Congressional GoldMedal; and

WHEREAS, following the terrorist attacks on our nation on
September 11, 2001, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew gathered a
group of international religious leaders to produce the first

joint statement with Muslim leaders that condemned the 9/11 1 attacks as "antireligious"; and 2 3 WHEREAS, in October 2005, the Ecumenical Patriarch, along 4 with Christian, Jewish, and Muslim leaders, cosponsored the 5 6 Conference on Peace and Tolerance II to further promote peace 7 and stability in southeastern Europe, the Caucasus region, and Central Asia through religious leaders' interfaith dialogue, 8 understanding, and action; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, the Orthodox Christian Church, in existence for 12 nearly 2,000 years, numbers approximately 300,000,000 members worldwide with more than 2,000,000 members in the United States; 13 14 and 15 WHEREAS, since 1453, the continuing presence of the 16 Ecumenical Patriarchate in Istanbul has been a living testament 17 to the religious coexistence of Christians and Muslims; and 18 19 WHEREAS, this religious coexistence is in jeopardy because 20 21 the Ecumenical Patriarchate is considered by the Turkish government to be the head of the Greek minority in Istanbul 22 exclusively, rather than the head of the Greek Orthodox Church; 23 and 24 25 WHEREAS, the Turkish government has limited the candidates 26 available to hold the office of Ecumenical Patriarch to only 27 Turkish nationals, and there remain fewer than 2,000 of the 28 29 Ecumenical Patriarch's congregation in Turkey today; and 30 WHEREAS, the Turkish government closed the Theological 31 32 School on the island of Halki in 1971 and has refused to allow it to reopen, thus impeding training for Orthodox Christian 33 34 clergy; and 35 WHEREAS, the Turkish government does not recognize the 36 37 Ecumenical Patriarchate as a legal entity, and is therefore confiscating all of its properties along with the majority of 38 the property belonging to the Greek community and its parishes, 39 40 and imposing high taxes on the Balouki Hospital and Home for the Aged, a charity hospital; and 41 42 43 WHEREAS, the European Union, a group of nations with a common goal of promoting peace and the well-being of its . 44 SCR HMS 2011-1650

1 peoples, began accession negotiations with Turkey on October 3, 2005; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the European Union defined membership criteria for 4 accession at the Copenhagen European Council in 1993, obligating 5 candidate countries to achieve certain levels of reform, 6 including stability of institutions guaranteeing democracy, 7 adherence to the rule of law, and respect for and protection of 8 minorities, human rights, and religious rights; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Turkish government's current treatment of the 11 Ecumenical Patriarchate is inconsistent with the membership 12 conditions and goals of the European Union; and 13 14 WHEREAS, Orthodox Christians in Hawaii and throughout the 15 United States stand to lose their spiritual leader because of 16 the deliberate actions of the Turkish government; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate of the 19 20 Order of Saint Andrew the Apostle, a group of laymen who each have been honored with a patriarchal title, or "offikion," by 21 the Ecumenical Patriarch for their outstanding service to the 22 Orthodox Church, will send an American delegation to Turkey to 23 meet with Turkish government officials, as well as the United 24 25 States Ambassador to the Republic of Turkey, regarding the Turkish government's treatment of the Ecumenical Patriarchate; 26 now, therefore, 27 28 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 29 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the 30 House of Representatives concurring, that the Republic of Turkey 31 is requested to: 32 33 Uphold and safeguard religious and human rights (1)34 without compromise; 35 36 Cease its discrimination against the Ecumenical (2) 37 Patriarchate; 38 39 Grant the Ecumenical Patriarch appropriate ecumenical (3) 40 recognition, ecclesiastic succession, and the right to 41 train clergy of all nationalities; and 42

(4) Respect the property rights, human rights, and religious rights of the Ecumenical Patriarchate;
