## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

## REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A CLEFT LIP AND CLEFT PALATE CENTER OF EXCELLENCE.

1 2	WHEREAS, cleft lip and cleft palate are birth defects that
2 3	affect the upper lip and roof of the mouth; and
4 5 6 7	WHEREAS, according to the March of Dimes Foundation, about 6,800 babies in the United States are born with oral-facial clefts each year; and
8 9 10 11	WHEREAS, these oral-facial birth defects occur more often among people of Asian ancestry and certain groups of Native Americans; and
12 13 14 15	WHEREAS, the causes of these birth defects are not well understood, but research shows that these birth defects occur very early in fetal development; and
16 17 18 19 20	WHEREAS, children who are born with a cleft lip or cleft palate typically experience feeding difficulties, frequent ear infections and hearing loss (which often resolves with treatment), speech difficulties, and dental problems; and
21 22 23 24 25	WHEREAS, treatment options include surgery, usually conducted in several stages, to close the lip and palate, and the first surgery is typically performed during the child's first year; and
26 27 28 29 30	WHEREAS, with treatment, most children with cleft lip or cleft palate do remarkably well with a full recovery, particularly if treatment is rendered soon after birth or in early childhood; and
31 32 33	WHEREAS, the standard of care for children with cleft lip or cleft palate should include treatment by a team of specialists, including pediatricians, plastic surgeons, dental

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specialists, otolaryngologists (ear, nose and throat 1 specialist), speech-language specialists, audiologists (hearing 2 specialists), and social workers, to ensure that all aspects of 3 treatment are coordinated; and 4 5 WHEREAS, more programs are needed to ensure that families 6 with children suffering from cleft lip or cleft palate 7 throughout Hawaii are provided with the resources and 8 information needed to obtain optimum care for children with 9 these birth defects; now, therefore, 10 11 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 12 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the 13 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 14 Health, in partnership with local experts, is requested to 15 create a Cleft Lip and Cleft Palate Center of Excellence; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Cleft Lip and Cleft Palate 18 Center of Excellence should promote awareness of cleft lip and 19 cleft palate birth defects and provide resources and information 20 to families with children affected by these birth defects; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 23 requested to submit a report to the Legislature no later than 24 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 25 2012 detailing strategies to establish the Cleft Lip and Cleft 26 Palate Center of Excellence along with a discussion of the 27 Department's statewide collaborative efforts to promote the 28 Center throughout Hawaii; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 31 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health. 32 33 34 35
