SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON WHETHER THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF HAWAII'S SEX OFFENDER LAWS ARE BEING MET AND WHETHER SEX OFFENDER LAWS ARE BEING IMPLEMENTED IN THE WAY THEY WERE INTENDED.

WHEREAS, in 1996, the federal government enacted what has 1 become known as "Megan's Law," requiring states to collect and 2 3 release relevant information necessary to protect the public from sexual offenders; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, in 1997, the Legislature passed Hawaii's own Megan's Law, codified as Chapter 846E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 7 and currently entitled "Registration of Sex Offenders and Other 8 Covered Offenders and Public Access to Registration 9 Information," requiring that individuals convicted of certain 10 offenses against children and certain sexual offenses register 11 12 with a sex-offender registry by providing information relating to their identity, residence, employment, education, medical 13 treatment, and vehicle; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Chapter 846E also allows for public notification 16 through the public release of certain registration information; 17 and 18 19 WHEREAS, over the years since their enactment, Hawaii's sex 20 21 offender laws have been amended to address constitutional issues 22 raised by the Hawaii Supreme Court as well as to comply with 23 federal law; and 24 25 WHEREAS, while previous studies have been undertaken to consider possible revisions to Hawaii's sex offender laws, no 26 27 study has been conducted to determine whether the goals and objectives of the state sex offender laws are being met, or 28 29 whether state sex offender laws are being implemented in the way they were intended; and 30



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2 WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 846E, the statewide sex 3 offender registry is administrated and maintained by the Hawaii 4 Criminal Justice Data Center of the Department of the Attorney 5 General; now, therefore, 6

7 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 8 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the 9 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of the 10 Attorney General is requested to conduct a study on the 11 objectives and implementation of Hawaii's sex offender laws; and 12

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, in its study, the Department of the Attorney General is requested to address:

- Whether the goals and objectives of the state sex offender laws are being met; and
- (2) Whether the state sex offender laws are being implemented in the way they were intended; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Department of the Attorney General is requested to submit its findings and recommendations, including any recommended legislation, to the Legislature no less than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Attorney General.
