## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

## URGING THE PROVISION OF OPPORTUNITIES FOR COMMUNITY INPUT ON POTENTIAL USES FOR THE FORMER KULANI CORRECTIONAL FACILITY.

1 WHEREAS, Kulani Correctional Facility was a minimum 2 security, program-oriented facility that assisted inmates in 3 developing marketable job skills; and 4

5 WHEREAS, Kulani Correctional Facility housed the largest 6 sex offender treatment program in the State and the most 7 successful in the nation with a recidivism rate of less than two 8 percent since 1988; and 9

10 WHEREAS, the State continues to transfer prisoners to 11 private facilities outside of Hawai'i at a cost in excess of 12 \$50,000,000 a year; and

14 WHEREAS, Native Hawaiians represent the highest percentage 15 of people incarcerated in out-of-state facilities, at forty-one 16 percent according to 2005 statistics from the Office of Hawaiian 17 Affairs; and

19 WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety announced the 20 closure of Kulani Correctional Facility in July 2009; and 21

WHEREAS, in January 2010, the Department of Public Safety executed a Memorandum of Agreement with the state Department of Defense to establish a Youth Challenge Academy Program at the former Kulani Correctional Facility; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has indicated support for
identifying alternative sites in the State to house inmates
currently serving their sentences in out-of-state facilities;
and

1 prisoners out of the State and to the resulting loss of jobs and 2 community service opportunities, and the Administration has 3 indicated a desire to reopen Kulani Correctional Facility; and 4

5 WHEREAS, adequate public input was not solicited to 6 determine the best use of Kulani Correctional Facility and 7 surrounding lands prior to the State's decision to transfer the 8 property to the Department of Defense; now, therefore, 9

10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 11 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, the 12 House of Representatives concurring, that the Governor is urged 13 to provide opportunities for community input on potential uses 14 for the former Kulani Correctional Facility; and 15

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director
of Public Safety, and Adjutant General.
