SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO CONTINUE WITH THE KAMEHAMEHA REALIGNMENT PROJECT TO ALLEVIATE TRAFFIC IN THE VICINITY OF LANIAKEA BEACH.

WHEREAS, Laniakea Beach, on the North Shore of Oahu, is
 known for its turtle population and surf, and is a popular
 destination for tourists and Hawaii residents; and

5 WHEREAS, a two-lane section of Kamehameha Highway that runs 6 next to Laniakea Beach has become a traffic bottleneck, with an 7 estimated two million tourists using the road each year, 8 resulting in cars regularly backed up for miles on both sides of 9 the road; and

11 WHEREAS, the traffic bottleneck presents safety hazards, as 12 people park their cars alongside the road and dart across the 13 highway to view the sights; and

15 WHEREAS, in an effort to alleviate traffic, the Department 16 of Transportation is studying the feasibility of either 17 realigning further inland the section of Kamehameha Highway that 18 runs next to Laniakea Beach or constructing a bypass road in the 19 vicinity; and

21 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation's realignment 22 project is currently in the planning phase, with an 23 environmental impact statement being prepared by a private 24 consultant; and

WHEREAS, the planning phase of the realignment project is anticipated to be completed in late 2012 or early 2013, to be followed by a design phase that will follow a schedule dependent on the results of the environmental impact statement; now, therefore,

32 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth 33 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, 34 that the Department of Transportation is urged to continue with 35 the Kamehameha Realignment Project, Vicinity of Laniakea, and to
